FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

The theme for Project Compassion this year places the emphasis on our commitment: "Give Lent 100%".

Pope Francis said, "The future does have a name... and its name is hope." Project Compassion offers hope to people most vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice.

Through Project Compassion we are empowering those in great need to shape a better future for themselves, their families and their communities.

Lives change when we all give 100%.

The first Sunday for giving will be 10th March, the first Sunday in Lent.

Next Sunday, 3rd March, young members of our parish who attend St Bede's College will ask us to participate in their Missionary Awareness Day. There will be a special third collection next Sunday.

Why does the Catholic Church commit its energies to action for social

justice? For close to 150 years, a body of teachings has been developed by successive Popes beginning with Pope Leo XIII giving his attention to the unjust conditions for working men and women that were part and parcel of the 'industrial revolution'. The Pope called for another revolution of justice. The Latin title of his letter is Rerum novarum meaning 'A discussion of new things'.

What is Catholic Social Teaching?

Catholic Social Teaching (also known as Catholic Social Doctrine) promotes a vision of a just society that is grounded in the Bible and in the wisdom gathered from experience by the Judeo-Christian communities of faith who have responded to social justice issues through history.

KEY THEMES IN CST

Human Dignity & the Unity of the **Human Family**

This is the starting point and central concern of Catholic thinking about human rights. Each person is created in the image and likeness of God and so has a God-given dignity. Each member of the human family is



equal in dignity and has equal rights because we are all children of the one God.

The Catholic tradition is opposed to anything that is opposed to life itself, or that violates the integrity of the human person, and anything that insults human dignity.

Solidarity

We are all really responsible for each other. It is not about a vague compassion, but involves a determination to commit oneself to working for change so that everyone will be able to reach their potential.

The Common Good

The common good is understood as the collection of social conditions that make it possible for each social group and all of their individual members to achieve their potential. Each social group must take account of the rights and aspirations of other groups, and of the whole human family.

Universal Destination Of Goods

The universal destination of goods refers to the fact that God intended the goods of creation for the use of all. Everyone has the right to access the goods of creation to meet their needs. People and nations have no right to squander resources when others are in need.

Participation

Because of their intelligence and free will, people have both a right and a duty to participate in those decisions that most directly affect them.

Subsidiarity

The principle of subsidiarity places responsibility as close as possible to the grassroots. The people or groups most directly affected by a decision or policy should have a key decision-making role.

In preparing this message, especially for the section on the six principles, I borrowed from a longer article by Sandie Cornish B.Ec. (Nctle), Lic. Soc. Sci. (PUG), M. Pub. Pol.

PLENARY COUNCIL DISCUSSIONS

Last Sunday after the 11.00am Mass, 20 Parishioners met to discuss the first question asked by the Plenary Council. We formed four groups and in the hour prayed, reflected and shared our thoughts. It was great to have the chance to share our ideas and listen to each other. The feedback from the session was positive and at the end people were encouraged to make a personal response

Groups in our parish that have participated so far include the Parish Advisory Group, St Vincent de Paul, Knights of the Southern Cross, St Patrick's School Leadership Team, and the 27 people last Sunday after Masses. The Parent and Friends Associations and Legion of Mary are intending to have their own meetings.

From the latest report from the Plenary Council national committee: "68,000 people have participated in the Listening and Dialogue phase. That multitude of stories and experiences will help shape the next phase -'Listening and Discernment' – and ultimately the agenda for the Plenary Council sessions in 2020 and 2021."

Quotation from Canon Law:

"Christ's faithful are at liberty to make known their needs, especially their spiritual needs, and their wishes to the (Bishops). They have the right, indeed at times the duty, ... to manifest ... their views on matters which concern the good of the Church. ... In doing so they must always respect the integrity of faith and morals." (Code of Canon Law, Canon 212, #2, #3) If the bishops had observed these prescriptions in the past how many innocents would have been preserved from immense suffering.
