**FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE** 

Dear Friends

An online news source featured an 'adult' Advent Calendar as a guide to purchases and leisure. Far from the advent calendar that opens up to the family day by day the wondrous mystery of the entry into human history of a child who is the Son of God, the tradition is now put to serve commercial interests. This is a simple, if unwelcome, manifestation of what it means to live in a secularized society.

The most suitable response from us is to consider what opportunity this gives ordinary Christians to be 'missionary disciples'. That is the call that Pope Francis makes over and over: consider yourself a 'missionary disciple', one who brings the good news of Jesus Christ into any situation. The opportunity to witness is always there, whether in an explicitly Christian society, a secularized society, a traditional society or any other.

The first week of the season of Advent presents us with the lens through which to view our moment in history. Whether it is cataclysmic events, or the daily challenges and stresses of family life, Advent is our celebration of faith that God is benevolent, he desires the salvation of individuals and the healing of the world. This is why he comes as the judge of the world.

If my cry is about an injustice that I am suffering, God hears my cry. If my lament is for my own failings, God hears my lament. If my need is for care and protection, God inspires in the heart of a neighbour a firm resolve to accompany me in charity and practical action. If I cannot find words good

enough to express my love of God and To be on guard against excess and the praise that I desire to offer him. God has promised that the Holy Spirit comes to my aid. We read in Romans 5:26: "When we do not know how to pray properly, then the Spirit personally makes our petitions for us in groans that cannot be put into words." This teaching of St Paul is a fundamental consolation in all our seeking for God.

The first Sunday of Advent each year recalls our faith that God will come in a judgement that we should not fear, even though we should we prepared at all times by our upright life. The trials that I have cited are symbolized in the biblical images of cataclysmic events. Before such experiences, our stance is one of trust. "(The king will) practise honesty and integrity in the land ... the city will be called: The-Lord-Our-Integrity." (1st reading) "Hold your heads high because your liberation is near at hand." (Gospel reading)

By living with serene trust in God, we are missionary disciples in the anxietyridden society of our time.

There is a second aspect to the first week of Advent. It is the call to watchfulness lest our "hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life." (Gospel reading)

Promotion of consumerism represents the secularized society's idea of being happy and joyful. There is a temptation that accompanies consumerism. It is to become forgetful of our neighbor in need. This is something that Pope Francis frequently warns against. The advent calendar mentioned above is a clear indicator of these attitudes.

anxiety, as the gospel recommends, is another act of witness by us missionary disciples.

The choice of scripture texts in the liturgies of the Advent season invites us to consider the welcome we give him as we contemplate the gift of his birth, as well as the welcome that we give to Christ on a daily basis. Advent ties our welcome of Christ to our practice of just living. This is what we will hear in the voice of John the Baptist calling us to conversion on the second Sunday of Advent.

This is not the place for the Pope or the priest to give prescriptions about how to act. Rather, it is the time in the Church's cycle of worship when we recall that God's dealings with us are entirely God's gift. Our world, our own life, our family and friends, our opportunities for health, shelter, education, relaxation, sport, employment are all of God's gift. God's greatest gift is the infant Christ. He is the 'reason for the season'.

To celebrate with faith the annual observance of the gift of his only Son in his human birth implies that we become collaborators of our God who has shown himself as the giver and the gift. Will this Advent help me to become myself the gift of Christ to the world?
