FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

REPORT ON PARISH RENEWAL AND THANKSGIVING CAMPAIGN

As I write this morning, I will go to Mass and hear this proclamation: "I am convinced that nothing can come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus." It's from the letter of St Paul to the Romans, chapter

This paean of joy and gratitude is the hallmark of our life as Christians. God is generous and God loves a generous giver. (Cf 2Cor 9:7)

THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF OUR CAMPAIGN

Well, our period of renewal and thanksgiving in June and July showed that we are very generous.

One Saturday night, I found two people in the St Patrick's junior school. They were printing, folding and placing into envelopes, a letter destined to be read in 745 households. In addition, about 150 envelopes were taken from the narthex of the two churches. This couple said it felt like a honeymoon over again, being free of all other tasks and able to chat without interruption.

This spirit of generosity animated the members of the Steering Committee and the members of the Expo Committee. It is the spirit that led 245 people to pledge a regular contribution for the next three years. It is the spirit that inspired 31 families from our schools to join the pledge. That is twice the number from our school families involving themselves as prior to the renewal.

Rediscover Your Parish



This generosity was shown by those who pledged for the first time, thereby maintaining our total number of contributors. Continuing contributors, as well as the new contributors, have pledged \$30,368.00 more than before. In addition, single donations amounted to \$3,367,00.

The generosity of all our volunteers, and of the professionals who created the banner and the video free of charge, resulted in expenses amounting to less than \$2,000.00.

I want to mention especially your generosity at each stage of your life. The elderly and others on fixed incomes have not abandoned their parish. The parents of growing families continue to support, they are joined by a new cohort who have made a decision to include the parish among their commitments.

CHALLENGES

The first is that we did not succeed in increasing the number of contributors. To find more practical support of the parish remains the long term concern.

The second is that the cash given in the second collection has not increased from its pre-campaign level (\$500 ca.) If regular worshippers who reside in another parish would consider raising their cash contribution, or consider joining the pledged thanksgiving, our concern about viability would be less.

The risk is that the natural attrition of contributors will overtake the new contributions, resulting in a decline in revenue.

PRIORITY

I pray that each of us will find a way to put into practice each day the theme of the campaign: MEET one another, ENGAGE with one another, SERVE gladly, all with JESUS as our heart's desire. That desire will sharpen and strengthen all our efforts.


