FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

I will leave for holiday this Sunday night.

The past two months have been very busy with the Parish Community Renewal and Thanksgiving, and with the final stages of setting up the Parish Office and Community Centre in the former convent. I'm looking forward to going away.

I want to say a big thanks to the two committees who orchestrated the renewal experience. The final elements will unfold while I am away. That is in good hands.

As for the community centre, the Parish Office is fully functional there. Enter from 3 Mitchell Street, or from Childers Street on the left hand side of the church. There is secure entry at the doors.

In a few weeks, the meeting areas will be operational. Our staff need some time still to set things up in the kitchen and organise the out of hours access for parish groups. Groups will be contacted to discuss their requirements for storage and their timetable.

On August 4th, the feast of our parish patron, St John Marie Vianney, occurs. On August 2nd, the school mass in honour of St John Vianney was celebrated with the grandparents of the school children.

The patron saint of each community in our parish was a holy and effective priest. Both St Patrick and St John Vianney were zealous and unselfish Man has a noble task:

preachers of the gospel. They succeeded in forming vibrant communities of Christians. These patrons set the bar high for your parish priests throughout the history of our two churches.

As we celebrate the holiness of John Vianney this weekend, I recall two visits to the village of Ars where he ministered in the nineteenth century. The place struck me with its hospitality. I arrived at midnight in 1966 with four companions from Nigeria, New Zealand and Australia. We knocked on the door of the orphanage that the saint set up and were given a warm welcome. The prayerful spirit struck me more recently in 1996 during my second visit, this time with Fr Peter Fulton who was celebrating the 25th anniversary of his ordination.

Both these qualities are evident at St John Vianney's church each Sunday.

Cardinal John Dew of Wellington, NZ, spoke recently about encouraging everyone in our parish communities to employ their gifts of grace and nature to build up their parish community. Quoting Pope Francis, he wrote:

"Pope Francis is showing in his leadership that ALL the baptised are engaged in the life of the Church, that ALL are to be 'journeying together.'

Every effort needs to be made to draw more and more people into the life of the Church. Ministry is not something priests do to people, it is something priests and people do together. ... SYNODALITY is the way to include people in decisions to do with their local Church.

He has emphasised the peripheries, the edges, the outskirts... For his first formal visit to a Roman parish in May 2013, Francis chose not a Baroque masterpiece near the Vatican but travelled to the outskirts of the city because, as he told the parishioners, 'We understand reality not from the centre, but from the outskirts.'

Just before he visited that parish he said 'We should not lock ourselves up in our parish, among our friends ... with people who think as we do – but instead the Church must step outside herself. To go where? To the outskirts of existence, wherever they may be' (Address 18th May 2013)."

I hope that our parish community centre will become a resource for this kind of belonging to our beloved Church in Mentone/Parkdale.

I look forward to seeing you on Ist September after time with friends in Canada, Ireland, Britain and Singapore. Thanks to Fr Ramsay who will be with you throughout. God bless everyone.
