FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

I will not comment on any way on the legal proceedings in Cardinal Pell's case.

Our only legitimate concern is that truth and justice be served in our society. This has been the call from victims and survivors of clerical abuse, and continues to be. This is the justification for the existence of an Appellate Court in our judicial system.

For the future, each parish community must maintain its commitment to be a safe hearth for every child and vulnerable adults. We must be seen as a welcoming foyer where safeguarding is an obvious dimension of our coming together for liturgy, for formation, for socialising and fundraising events.

For the present, our spiritual life, our very surrender of faith needs nourishment. Following is an extract from an essay by Fr John Chalmers in the Lenten publication *Compassion* from the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

Reflecting the Good News

Who could ever claim that the Bible is bland and boring? Today's gospel story reverberates with colourful twists and turns. Here we find Luke the story-teller at his ingenious best, uncorking the Transfiguration so that we might engage the transcendent, even though our boots may get muddied. How does Peter recognise Moses and Elijah? Perhaps it's because Moses and Elijah are both mountain men. And as English mountaineer Brian Blessed puts it: no one can climb mountains and not believe in God.

Mt Sinai was a place of promise for Moses. For Elijah, Mt Carmel reveals the divine presence in the gentle breeze. What if Transfiguration marries mystery to muddied feet?

Jesus' encounter with Moses and Elijah stirs something deep within the disciples. It's clear that Jesus is on a different wave-length. And it's most attractive.

Half-way through the story we hear that they are now disenchanted, weighed down by sleep.

While clouds generally signal a divine presence, this time the bitter tears of disenchantment weigh them down. It's here that we reach the heart of the story. It is often claimed that the opposite of faith is doubt. Not at all! The opposite of faith is fear. And Peter, James and John are well acquainted with fear. Fear silences them. In the end, none of them tell of the things they have seen. No one tells those stories that everyone needs to hear.

Maybe the pathway to encountering the divine still travels via enchantment and disenchantment. Maybe each of us is accompanied by Moses and Elijah, so that we may rekindle God's promise and unpretentious presence along the way. This will see us finding the divine footprints even in gaping emptinesses. Stations of the Cross During Lent: Stations of the Cross will be at **7pm** each Friday

100% HOPE



Tati is a Dayak woman, living in a remote forest of West Kalimantan, Indonesia, with her husband and two of her three children. Her two youngest children go to school nearby while her 19 year old son lives in a rented room close to his school 60 kilometres away. The family pays for his livingaway-from-home expenses, in addition to providing for school expenses. Tati's Dayak culture is deeply linked to the rainforest and her family has relied on it for sustenance for generations.

Over the last few years, communities which depend on the native forests have seen them shrink, along with vital habitats for endangered orangutans, rhinos and tigers. Caritas Australia, with its partners Caritas Indonesia – KARINA and the Diocesan Caritas are working with local communities to develop alternative sustainable livelihoods, by training them in eco-tourism activities.

Before Tati joined the Caritas program, she and her husband mainly earned their income from rubber tapping and raising chickens.

Now, Tati has increased her family income ten times over by cooking for tourists and making souvenirs. Her community is also developing a strong financial base so that it can manage its own land.

Around 600 people have directly benefitted from the program so far – with hopes it can be expanded to other districts.

"I hope to continue living with fresh air, clear water, protected forest," Tati says, " and to be able to pay for my children's education and that my grandchildren can still enjoy the forest."
