OUR LADY AND THE LIFE OF THE WORLD TO COME

Sometimes we hear people compare the human body to a shell, which is cast off at death, having served its purpose. At death, so it is inferred, the Hellenist philosophy, stresses the soul is freed from the body and returns to its natural home.

However, as attractive as this may be to some, it has its basis in Greek philosophy. It is not Christian teaching. And this is because, firstly, such thinking diminishes the importance and significance of the human body. (In fact, it almost expresses contempt for the body). Secondly, it trivialises and softens the reality of death.

For Christians, eternal life is not merely the survival of a disembodied spirit. Eternal life must include the salvation of the whole person, not just a disembodied spirit. Sacred Scripture teaches us that the body, in some way that we do not fully understand, will also be involved in eternal life. We say in the Creed every Sunday, "And I look forward to the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come."

It is fundamental to the Christian tradition that the soul and the body go together. They are two sides of the one coin. God has made us body and soul, and they belong naturally together. Our salvation, (the word comes from the Latin, and means "wholeness") involves not a division of the whole person into two 'bits'body and soul - but the resurrection of the *whole* person, body and soul.

So, for the Church, the human person is a unity of body and soul. Neither part exists, or continues to exist, ultimately, apart from

the other. Resurrection refers to the whole person.

The Church, following the clear teaching of St. Paul and the early Church, not the speculation of reality of a true and integrated human life, beyond the grave – not merely a partial survival of one part of our humanity.

The Bible, however, does not attempt to give a scientific or biological description of the nature of the resurrection-body.

But it is clear from Scripture that the resurrection-body is very different from the human body that we know. It belongs to a new order. All we can say is that our resurrection-body will be like the risen body of Jesus, visible, tangible and recognisable, but not limited by time and space.

Next Thursday the Church celebrates the principal feast day of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that of her Assumption, her death and her new life with her Son and her Saviour, Jesus Christ, in the heavenly places. It is a Day of **Obligation for all Catholics.** [See elsewhere in this bulletin for Mass times].

On the Solemnity of Our Lady's Assumption, we rejoice in the heavenly homecoming of the one who gave birth to God the Son, who looked upon his broken body on the Cross, and who in the Upper Room of the first Eucharist, experienced the birth of his Body, the Church at the first Pentecost.

From the earliest times, in the light of the resurrection of her Son, Christians have accepted that Mary, the first and

only truly faithful disciple of Jesus, has attained the resurrection state to which all Christians look forward. Just as all die in Adam, so all will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order. Christ as the firstfruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him', says St. Paul in his first Letter to the Corinthians.

Since Mary carried the Saviour in her womb and gave birth to him, and throughout his life was so intimately involved in his work of salvation, it is appropriate, it is only right, that she who belongs to him above all others, who was first bound to him by ties of motherhood, should share before all others in the full fruits of his victory over death.

Our Lady redeemed by her Son - as we are – and having passed through the gate and portal of death – as we shall - now shares the same glory of the promised resurrection-life which we also hope to enjoy.

In celebrating the Solemnity of the Assumption, Holy Church rejoices in the humble village girl of Nazareth, whom God raised on high, and to whom has been given a glorious and incorruptible crown as Queen of Heaven.

We focus on the core doctrine of our holy faith, the resurrection of Mary's Son Jesus Christ, and we reflect on our own hope in the resurrection and the life of the world to come.

May Our Lady, assumed into the glory of heaven, pray for us at the Throne of Grace.
