FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

This Sunday's Gospel reading about the total commitment and generosity of a poor widow in contrast to the exploitative demands of the Temple authorities coincides with an address last Wednesday in Rome by Pope Francis on the Seventh Commandment. It provides a challenging perspective, drawing on Scripture and the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

"Dear Brothers and Sisters, good morning!

There is no culture in which theft and abuse of goods is licit. However, it's worthwhile to open oneself to a broader reading of this Word in the light of Christian wisdom.

Let us listen to what the Catechism says: 'In the beginning God entrusted the earth and its resources to the common stewardship of mankind to take care of them, master them by labour and enjoy their fruits. The goods of creation are destined for the whole human race' (Catechism n. 2402), 'even if the promotion of the common good requires respect for the right to private property and its exercise' (n. 2403).

The world is rich in resources to ensure the primary goods to all. If there is hunger on earth, it's not because there is a lack of food! Rather, because of the demands of the market, sometimes it is destroyed; it's thrown away. What is lacking is a free and farsighted entrepreneurship, which ensures adequate production, and solidary planning, which ensures an equitable distribution. All wealth, to be good, must have a social dimension.

In this perspective, the positive and broad meaning appears of the Commandment to 'not steal.' 'The ownership of any property makes its holder a steward of

Providence' (n. 2404). In fact, if I'm unable to give something, it's because that thing possesses me, has power over me and I'm a slave of it.

We have heard so many times what the people of God says: 'The devil enters by the pockets.' It begins with love of money, the hunger to possess; then vanity follows: 'Ah, I'm rich' and I boast about it; and, in the end, pride and arrogance. This is the devil's way of acting in us. But the door of entry is the pockets.

Christ Himself, though He was God, 'did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself (Philippians 2:6-7) and He enriches us with His poverty (Cf. 2 Corinthians 8:9).

Dear brothers and sisters, once again Jesus Christ reveals to us the full meaning of Scripture. 'Not to steal' means: love with your goods. Take advantage of your means to love as you can. Thank you."

Regarding another kind of theft, a warning has been sent to parishes about a forthcoming exhibit at Melbourne Showgrounds, "BODY WORLDS Vital".

- I) Display of human remains is inconsistent with views held by many religious groups. The precise source of the human bodies is undisclosed, though it appears to be in China. The human remains in the exhibits should be given a proper burial on humanitarian grounds given strong evidence that they are not willing donors.
- 2) China has a deep-rooted tradition to preserve the entire body intact after death for burial, and almost no Chinese would donate their remains to hospitals, let alone to a human specimen factory.

3) The exhibition displays full body cadavers as well as human body parts, organs, without any information of source provided at the exhibit, and is misleadingly promoted in the name of education, science and art.
