Second Sunday in Lent, Year C: 13th March 2022

In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration. During our Lenten journey, we are called to be transformed and hear God's voice tell us, "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." Like those first disciples, we can become afraid but sent from God to show us what it we acknowledge how good it is to be here with the Lord.
