### WRITING YOUR MEMOIR

Parishioners are invited to a meeting to help them consider the options of writing their memoir. **The meeting will be held in the St Patrick's Parish community centre at 10am Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> April.**

It is suggested that the main aim of your memoir is for you to pass on to your family and later generations your experiences and observations you have learnt during your life, especially about your Catholic faith journey.

It is important that committed Catholics pass on to others in their family and future generations their Christian faith and what it means to them. A memoir is one great way to do this.

Writing your memoir is not as hard as you may think and often the hardest part is to get started. If you can use the word processor on a computer. And remember if you need help in doing this you can ask your grandchildren!

The simplest method is to move chronologically through your life from childhood, school, career and sporting or hobby interests, and include your Catholic faith development at these times. Jim Mount will outline how he is writing his own memoir, but everyone will have their own ideas how it is best to write their own memoir, which is good. I did not do a lot of research and depended mainly on my memory and old photos and memorabilia, certificates I have collected.
