SAINT PATRICK - SAINT JOHN VIANNEY

1st Sunday of Lent (Year A): 1st March 2020



Before Christmas, I spoke about a meeting called by the Vicar General of the Archdiocese to begin a discussion of the future of the parishes in the Bayside area. In the arc that sweeps south from Gardenvale to Mentone on the west side of Nepean Highway, all the parish priests will be retired by the start of 2021, with the exception of Brighton East and Hampton East.

Three initial facts shape any decision about the future presence of priests in the entire area.

First, there is great variety in the size of the parish communities across the entire metropolitan area. Four communities in this Bayside area have a population of less than 3,000 Catholics, while Cragieburn is home to 24,000 Catholics, with Laverton a close second with 21,000 Catholics.

Second, the number of Masses in a parish does not reflect the population. In Bayside's eight parishes, there are 27 weekend Masses attended by a total of 2,500 worshippers. In Cragieburn 1400 worshippers have five Masses with two priests, in Laverton 2,700 worshippers have five Masses with two priests.

Third, there is a chronic lack of experienced priests to staff parishes, currently there are at least six parishes without a permanent priest.

Discussion up to this point is converging on the realisation that the six priests who will retire this year cannot all be replaced. To discover the best way forward, these three considerations can be a guide.

First, the life of the local Catholic community is the source of the energy for evangelization, both of its own members, and of newcomers whom the community may attract.

Second, provision of Sunday Mass should be adequate without extending any priest beyond three Masses for the weekend, and without relying upon a 'supply priest' each weekend. The available supply priests are ageing, an ever- diminishing cohort.

Third, wise use of parish plant is important for parish life and for 'the bottom line'. With current technology, an office would not be needed in each community, just as we operate in Mentone/Parkdale East, provided the life and activity of each community is supported.

It has been stated in the meetings that churches will not be closed.

'The Joy of the Gospel' was the first apostolic exhortation issued by Pope Francis back in 2013. He describes parish life in paragraph 24.

The positive view that the Pope provides can help us see this time of change as an opportunity rather than a crisis.

- A community of missionary disciple
- The Lord takes the first step, therefore we can move forward, go out to others, seek those who have fallen away, stand at the crossroads and welcome the outcast



- Such a community has an endless desire to show mercy
- Gets involved by word and deed in people's daily lives
- Bridges distances
- Bears fruit of new life, however imperfect or incomplete these may appear
- Evangelisation with joy becomes beauty in the liturgy, as part of our daily concern to spread goodness.
- The evangelising power of popular piety (paragraphs 122-126): it manifests a thirst for God; it makes people capable of generosity and sacrifice; a way of feeling part of the Church and a manner of being missionaries.

COMMUNAL AND SOCIETAL REPERCUSSIONS (chapter four): Commitment to society; church teaching on social questions; social dialogue: ecumenism with other Christians, Judaism, other religions

These pointers may help all the parishes take up a new opportunity to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our region.



Shirley, 36, is an indigenous Manide woman living in a remote province of the Philippines. She is a mother of four and the sole breadwinner of the family, as her husband is sick. But Shirley was struggling to support the whole family and keep her children in school.

Indigenous minorities in the Philippines face regular discrimination and disadvantage, limiting their access to education, employment and healthcare. But thanks to Caritas Australia's Supporters, Shirley's live has transformed. She is now leading her community to take a stand against discrimination, improve health and education, and pave the way for a better future.

Unequal access to health services means that many indigenous children and families cannot access basic medical care. Preventable diseases, such as tuberculosis, dengue fever and measles are common among their community, and there is a high maternal and newborn mortality rate.

With Caritas Australia's support, Shirley trained to become an indigenous health worker and a leader in her community. She has learnt to supplement her income so she is able to feed her family. The program has also helped Shirley's children with school fees, uniforms and supplies.

Shirley says there's still a long way to go to fight for better employment opportunities for the Manide tribe and to reduce discrimination, but together they'll get there.
