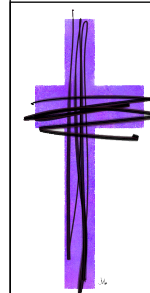
LENT

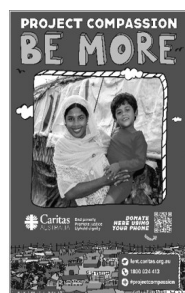
Prayer / Meditation
