FATHER MICHAE'S MESSAGE

Dear Friends

I am writing from Torquay where the annual Melbourne Clergy Conference is taking place.

I will share with you the notes I took during a wonderful talk by Robyn Miller, chief executive of MacKillop Family Services. While I was on holiday, you contributed to a special collection for Catholic Social Services. MacKillop Family Services is one of the agencies whom you support by your contribution to that collection.

In thanking Robyn, Fr Joe Caddy AM, our Vicar General, said that Robyn lives her life as a mother for the hopeless, that too is the work of MacKillop, and that's what is essentially Catholic. Enjoy her very Catholic view of life.

"I was thinking of the priests I knew growing up. I was flown in a single engine Cessna to the PNG highlands by Fr Barry Hughes to visit Melbourne Overseas Mission. Little did my parents know that we were grounded on one of the Torres Strait islands for repairs! At Kanabea, I visited Cyril Blake, Peter Fulton, and Robin and Vince Cafarella. The last three were involved in a plane crash in which Vince died. I met my husband there. I look back at our family and at the gift of priesthood in our family. A lot of what you do is confidential, unseen, unheralded.

For the church, this is a time to grow. I began with Catholic Family Welfare Bureau in Carlton. I begged the director for some money for a woman It's called the Sanctuary Model who needed shoes. That's how we helped.

You can work with children, bit if you put them back in the same paddock ... I started with ten years at the high rise flats in Brunswick Street. There wasn't the compliance requirements of today; you could do a lot. I was working with families who didn't have the start that I had in my family.

I worked 14 years at Bouverie Street. Brain development was just being understood, there was so much mother blame that wasn't justified. I became child protection worker.

I worked next in the department, my cases were always in the Herald Sun. Their sensation, our clients pain and deprivation. On one occasion, we were going to be on the front page of Herald Sun, but the journalist's mother mistakenly gave him a diuretic I'll tell you a story of a tough ABC so we didn't make the front page.

Now I'm with MacKillop, it's our vision to show large heartedness. We have to seek funding, jump the hoops, but we've retained the ethos.

There are 90 foster homes, 1400 children in foster care. The religious orders were ahead of their time. Gospel ethos guided the religious, and we've inherited that. We have a preschool wth five kids on the border of NSW and QLD at Goodoga. They're gorgeous. That's how far afield we will go.

We've used a trauma induced model of care. Trauma is embedded in right brain, so it lacks a verbal memory, and needs some stimulus to retrieve the memory.

devised by Sandra Bloom. We try to excel in understanding hope since our families are deprived of hope.

Our children are taught this SSELF guidance: Self - safety - emotion - loss - future. Trauma destroys trust and relationships formation. The children know there is a safety plan for them at school. We need to give them opportunity to know that their mind is developed, hearts broadened, their souls are nurtured.

All our work is geared to keep families together. On any night we have 800 children in our care. They miss out on rituals that mark time, e.g., Christmas.

We're bringing in critical reflection to our workforce, in the Catholic spiritual tradition of reflective time.

radio interview. I was following our self-care advice: in trauma you have to increase self-care. 'Take a deep breath' has physiological bases. Part of the trick is not to get into numbing behaviour. There I was, breathing deeply as the curly question was about to be spoken when the power went off. I thanked St Mary of the Cross for that!

A mother was asked did she love one of her children more than others. 'Yeah,' she replied, 'only when they need it.' "

Our conference topic was knowing and loving Jesus so that our missionary approach can be effective. The archbishop reminded us that we are to have no privileges, the opposite leads to greed; no exemptions, the opposite leads to sloth; no exceptions, the latter leads to pride. Please pray for me and all priests.
