The Eucharistic Action In The Presence Of The **Blessed Sacrament**

Part Three: LITURGICAL GESTURES AND **POSTURES**

Dear Friends

I propose the following postures for our liturgical celebrations. As the quotation that follows informs us, one element of our fruitful participation in a sacrament is to engage the correct choice of posture because sacraments are effective signs, in words and objects, of unseen realities of God's grace. Our movements and posture are not signs as such, but they make up the context in which the signs that we use become understandable and apt.

"The purpose of the sacraments is to sanctify men, to build up the body of Christ, and, finally, to give worship to God; because they are signs they also instruct. They not only presuppose faith, but by words and objects they also nourish, strengthen, and express it; that is why they are called 'sacraments of faith.' ... It is therefore of the highest importance that the faithful should easily understand the sacramental **STANDING:** two clarifications: signs." (Decree on the Sacred Liturgy [SC] #59)

PROCESSION OF MINISTERS:

Procession of ordained and other ministers

Arriving at the sanctuary, all genuflect to the Blessed Sacrament, or, in the case of the cross bearer, thurifer and candle bearers, reverence the Blessed Sacrament. They do the same when leaving the sanctuary at the conclusion of the liturgy. When passing across the altar during the celebration, all in the procession reverence the altar and altar crucifix with a bow of the head (no reverence to the tabernacle).

OTHER PROCESSIONS:

process to the centre, Lectors reverence the altar and altar crucifix with bowed head:

> return to their place immediately by the shortest way,

making reverence if they pass the altar crucifix

Gospel procession of ordained, with candle bearers and thurifer: no reverence, unless passing altar crucifix.

Procession of Gifts GIRM #44

Come forward without genuflecting, making a slight bow to the minister. Reverence the altar crucifix before returning by shortest way.

Extraordinary Ministers of Eucharist GIRM #44

No genuflections, except at the closing of the tabernacle.

Reverence if passing the altar crucifix

Collectors are not in a procession. They genuflect when crossing the tabernacle/altar.

SILENCE: For meditation: at the conclusion of each reading of the word of God and the homily, silence is observed (GIRM #45; 55:3; 66:3) for about 10 seconds

Even before the celebration itself, it is a praiseworthy practice for suitable silence to be observed. (GIRM #45)

After the priest invites the assembly: Pray, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Almighty Father, then the assembly stands (GIRM in Australia #43); inevitably, it is not possible to achieve perfect coordination at this. The standing posture that begins with the Lord's Prayer is continued until when the Lamb of God CONCLUDES, because it is a hymn of the people. Once concluded, all kneel in preparation to receive Holy

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION:

Communion (GIRM #43).

The Australian Catholic Bishops' Conference stipulated that either a bow of the head or a genuflection is permitted before receiving the sacrament. One should take care not to disturb others. The universal Church permits Holy Communion to be taken in the hand or on the tongue. When communicating on the tongue, it is helpful that the communicant keeps their head still; please try not to present a 'moving target' before the minister of Holy Communion. Those who take Holy Communion in the hand. must consume the sacred Host immediately before moving away.

I hope that this presentation helps clarify what is expected of us in the Church's worship. The spirit in which to put this into practice would be to recall that all gestures and bodily postures serve "the common spiritual good of the People of God, rather than arbitrary choice." (GIRM #42)

This week commences Lent, our 40-day journey to the Resurrection of Our Lord at Easter



Lent Traditional Discipline Lent recalls baptism and stresses a penitential spirit. By these means especially, Lent readies us for celebrating the paschal mystery after a period of closer attention to the Word of God, and more ardent prayer. Lenten penance should not be only internal and individual but also external and social, such as support of Project Compassion

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

All aged 19-59 are bound to fast. All aged 15 and over are bound to abstain. The wonderful gift of the Lord's merciful love is offered in a special way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Lent is a most appropriate time to receive this Sacrament

SAFEGUARDING OF CHILDREN AND VULNERABLE ADULTS

Our Archdiocese operates under the regulatory framework set up by Victorian law. New offences relating to failure to report suspected 'reportable behaviour' or any kind of abuse are now in effect.

This requires each parish to have a 'Safeguarding Committee'. I am currently approaching parishioners to serve on this committee.

Another requirement, that will be overseen by this committee, is that all volunteers undertake an annual renewal of their awareness of the legal requirements to ensure the safety of vulnerable persons.

The renewal will be achieved by engaging with a 30 minute video based review of volunteer's knowledge of what is required of them. It is intended to hold this in groups at the Parish Community Centre in a social atmosphere. This ambition may boggle the imagination of some of us, but we will try it.

Despite its legalese, the requirement is an expression by our entire parish community to provide a safe place at all times for children and other vulnerable persons. A parish of Catholic Christians should excel at this for it is at the heart of our raison d'etre – 'Let the little children come to me'.

Please pray for God's blessing and guidance as we prepare for this innovation. It may be of interest to know that there are approximately 200 pages of information for the parish priest to digest.
