Father Michael's Message

Dear Friends Today has been set as THE SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF



GOD for all Catholic parishes.

The logo shows Jesus, on the way to Emmaus on the afternoon of his resurrection from the dead, explaining the Scriptures about him to the two confused disciples This took place before the Risen Lord broke bread with them. Thus, we understand the close link between the Word of God and all the Sacraments. (Aperuit illis #1, 6)

The Word enlightens the hearer about the presence of the Lord in the sacrament that is celebrated. Accordingly, there is a specific lectionary for each sacrament, as well as for funerals. Francis cites the Second Vatican Council that reminded us that "the Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she has venerated the Lord's body ... (There is) one table of the word of God and the body of Christ" (Dei verbum, #21)

In this short letter (Aperuit illis ['He opened their eyes']) to inaugurate this annual observance, Pope Francis remarks that "a day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a yearlong event. ... We need to develop a closer relationship with Scripture; otherwise, our hearts will remain cold and our eyes shut, struck as we are by so many forms of blindness." (AI #8)

Francis assists our reading of Scripture with five basic points. I present two this week and three next week.

First, the UNITY of the Hebrew and New Testament Scriptures. In his familiar conversation with the disciples, Jesus showed that all the Scriptures are one since all the Scriptures lead to himself, Christ, the bearer of salvation for us all. (Al #6)

Second, the INERRANCY of the Scriptures. "We must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully and without error, teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation, wished to see confided to the sacred Scriptures" (Dei verbum #11). "The Bible is not a collection of history books or a chronicle, ... The evident historical setting of the books of the Bible should not make us overlook their primary goal, which is our salvation." (Al #9) Hence, there is no guarantee that every detail of chronology, of geography, of political situations will be correct. We always seek the truth which assists our salvation that is contained in any text.
