FATHER MICHAEL'S MESSAGE

ALL SAINTS AND ALL SOULS AND HALLOWEEN

Dear Friends

In November, our Church remembers all the Saints and prays for the souls of the Faithful Departed. In our parish churches, there will be extra Masses on 1st and 2nd November to make it easy to celebrate our saintly parents and grandparents, and to pray for all the faithful departed.

Competing with the days of prayer, Halloween is being strongly promoted by the supermarkets and others. Today, Halloween is usually innocuous enough, though it can be expensive, but its origins are darker. Centuries ago in Europe, the pagans saw the onset of winter as the time to fear death in a most literal way. Winter constituted a threat of sparse harvest ending in starvation.

They believed that the souls of their ancestors came back seeking the comfort of home and food. There were many rituals meant to ward off these threats and to pacify their restless ancestral spirits. Hence, the ghostly costumes of modern day revivals of Halloween. Halloween was a reversion to the pagan reign of fear.

All Saints and All Souls is the Christian alternative. All Saints Day celebrates gratefully the healing given by God's grace to a Christian. Countless Christian men and women have shown forth that grace in saintly living day by day. We praise God for his grace in their lives on All Saints Day.

All Souls Day was the Church's turn to pray for the souls of their deceased family and friends. The prayer of the community of believers at Mass is united with the efficacy of Christ's death and his victory over sin. The Mass was offered for all deceased souls who might be still on the path of purification.

The two days of prayer were a way of offering the Good News of Jesus' victory over sin and death. It was meant not to scare people (that is the vestige of the old pagan religion which features in advertising at present) but to give them hope.

It is very valuable to share with children the good news that death is not to be feared. If Halloween celebrations in our families pick up on the old, dark side it becomes harder to introduce our children to our faith and hope in eternal life.

PLENARY COUNCIL 2020 is a two year long opportunity for us all to listen to what each has to say. To complete the Council's work, all our bishops and a significant number of laymen and laywomen will have two separate weeklong meetings to map the Church's future.

Plenary Councils of the Church have been regularly held in Australia, most recently in 1937. The dust has well and truly settled from the last Plenary. The bishops have Pope Francis's agreement to stir us all into a stronger commitment in our life within the Catholic Church.

The first step is under way in many parishes. Over 1,000 reports have been written. For our parish, I discussed with the Parish Advisory Group this week how to take part.

I will write three more short articles to acquaint everyone with the Plenary Council. After the last one, it will be Advent, the Church's time to prepare our hearts and minds to receive God's gift of his Son.
