#### **EASTERTIDE**

We are reminded each year that the Paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday, and the Paschal Vigil) are one act of worship, continued over three days.

The Church, in her liturgy, extends the festival of Easter joy over fifty days, thus pointing to another liturgical 'trilogy'. The liturgies of the three great feasts of Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost derive from the manner in which our Jewish ancestors in faith celebrated key moments in which they experienced God's presence among them.

The new People of God in the Church celebrates Christ's victory over death and sin on Easter Day, his entry into the glory of God on Ascension Day, and the gift of the Holy Spirit - 'the power from on high' that Christ promised — on Pentecost Day.

Easter is the Christian fulfilment of the feast of Passover, the annual commemoration of God's liberation of the chosen people from captivity. Christians are liberated from sin and death through faith in Christ, raised from the dead. He is the true Paschal Lamb; we celebrate the Paschal Mystery.

Ascension, occurring forty days after the feast of the Resurrection of Christ, fulfils the forty year pilgrimage of the chosen people before they entered the Promised Land. Moses, their prophet and leader, never crossed the Jordan River into the land of promise. They were led by a pillar of cloud by day and of fire by night. (Ex 13: 21)

Christ, our Lord and Saviour, "together with his whole humanity enters into the glory of God... 'Man', says Pope Benedict, 'finds room in God.' "(YC # 109) Christ ascending to the Father brings our human nature into its true home, the land of promise. The cloud and the heavens symbolize his divine glory.

Pentecost is the fulfilment of the feast of Weeks when the chosen people gathered to give thanks for the Law.

At Pentecost, the Church receives not a written Law that cannot save, but the gift of a new heart, 'heart of flesh' in place of a heart of stone. (Jr 31:31-34). This is the interior law of the new covenant. The gift of God himself in the third Person of the holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit gives us the possibility of serving God in inner freedom. At Pentecost, "Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit." (CCC # 731)


This Spirit, literally the 'sacred breath' of God, enlivens the Church. The Spirit endows the Church with gifts. These gifts enable the preaching of the gospel and they bring about the unity of all peoples who are gathered into a new dwelling place where God can be found. No longer do we meet in physical tents, but our community of faith is a temple of living stones (1 Peter 2:5) where God dwells among men and women.

From the Catechism and its editions for youth and children, I offer three short reflections on the Ascension:

I. "The irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory (is) symbolized by the cloud and by heaven." (CCC #659) This exalted notion is of real import for us who believe. The Ascension "does not mean that Jesus simply disappeared ... He leads us out of the darkness of this world into the infinite light of God." (YCK #42)

The Ascension of the Lord encourages us to continue to seek the light when events, sufferings, or sin might suggest that the good world has become dark. If we are tempted to lose confidence in our personal experience of being human, the Ascension assures us that the purpose for our existence is to enter with our humanity into a share in divine glory, just as our Saviour has gone before us.

2. "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." (Jn I 2:32) (With these words, Jesus intimates that he), "the one priest



The Ascension of Christ the High Priest reminds us that all our worship is grafted onto his worship of the Father. We can pray the community's Eucharist with tranquillity. Christ is the Priest who offers every Mass, we unite our intentions with his intention of loving obedience towards the Father and of loving service of one another. For our sake, he is "the altar, the priest and the Lamb of sacrifice." (Preface V of Easter)

3. "Being seated at the Father's right hand signifies the inauguration of the Messiah's kingdom ...: 'To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him.' (Dan 7:14) (CCC #664)

Seated at the right hand does not mean that he is far from us. "He is over us, and the only One to whom we bend the knee in worship; he is with us as Head of his Church; he is ahead of us as Lord of history; he comes to meet us ... to renew and perfect the world." (YC # 110)

Eastertide "is not a kind of nostalgia. It is returning to our first love, in order to receive the fire which Jesus has kindled in the world and to bring that fire to all people." (Pope Francis, at the Easter Vigil, 19 April 2014) (Cited in YC p. 70)


