"SYMBOL OF CHRIST, THE TRUE CORNER STONE OF THE CHURCH"

Dear Friends

Friday 13th March was the sixtieth anniversary of the blessing and opening of St Patrick and the Holy Angels church. The quotation above is the words on the foundation stone located on Rogers Street side of the building. While laying and blessing the stone two and a half years earlier, Archbishop Simonds remarked that Fr O'Hanlon's choice of words was a clear statement of St Paul's understanding of the Church.


Christians are exposed to the same faults and sins that bedevil human community; they should first turn their gaze to Christ, the true foundation stone, rather than to themselves and their own efforts as they seek to develop the body of Christ in the world. (Paul's Letter Corinth)

Returning in March 1960, Archbishop Simonds "congratulated the parish priest on the erection of a church, grand in its dimensions and beautiful in its construction. ... (It) may well be the last really large church to be built for some time in the archdiocese." He paid tribute to the sacrifices made by the parishioners in order to realize the dream of raising up "this great jewel in the service of God."

In May 1965, the church was consecrated, completing the work of the founding priest and parishioners begun 80 years previously. The relics of St Heliodorus and of St Blandina were sealed in the altar stone. Heliodorus is attested only by his name; Blandina was a young girl, likely a slave, martyred in Lyons in 177 AD.

Upon retiring in 1973, Fr O'Hanlon repeated in the parish magazine ('THE ANGELUS') his words upon arriving in the parish: "Our first duty is prayer for help and guidance. ... Of course, God will expect us to co-operate. We need many and willing workers, generous hearts, the spirit of sacrifice, and above all, charity among all."

Times, morals and expressions of faith have changed in the intervening sixty years. In whatever circumstances, Christ remains the true foundation stone of the life of his Church.



Our prayer for vocations remains important, yet I sometimes wonder whether the small number of priestly vocations today is God's way of inviting us to prize the Christian vocation of each baptized person. Prayer for vocations would intercede for a personal attachment to Christ who called us with love at our baptism. Equally, our prayer opens our heart to daily dedication to being his faithful witnesses.

The discussions just commenced about the future configuration of our Catholic communities in the Bayside area would be most effective if these intentions for the personal commitment of each of us were at the forefront of our meetings.



Twenty-seven-year-old Phany, lives in a village in western Cambodia. Struggling to earn a living as a rice farmer, she was forced to leave her daughter behind in the village, to take up construction work in the city.

Then in 2016, Phany joined a Caritas supported program, learning more productive farming and irrigation techniques. Her community learned to work together for better water management, to combat drought.

Over 70 percent of Cambodia's population live in rural communities — and farming family's living in poverty are the most food insecure. Thirteen percent of Cambodians live below the poverty line, while 35 out of every 1000 babies die due to malnutrition.

In 2016, Phany joined the <u>Upholding</u> <u>Community Dignity Together program</u>, where she learnt new farming techniques, such as a drip irrigation system which enabled her to get a better yield from her vegetable crops and to conserve water for drier periods. She also learnt how to grow vegetables and raise chickens and ducks. Phany's community also took part in training in health, nutrition, hygiene and disaster preparedness, arming them with better strategies to cope with environmental changes.
