St Patrick's Parish Mentone Rosary Procession 15 May 2021 at 5pm

Rosary procession at St Patrick's School Oval. Please bring Rosary Beads and invite your friends. Join us in this opportunity to invoke the Blessed Mother's intercession and protection over our country and our Church. It is always a good idea to walk with the Blessed Mother. But in a particular way during these days of confusion and concern on the part of so many, it's a great opportunity to recommit ourselves to Jesus in and through Mary.

Mother's Day: Christian Origins.

Mother's Day began originally in England and Wales. It was held on the Fourth Sunday of Lent [Laetare Sunday] two weeks before Easter Sunday.

In the 16th century on that day, it was the custom for people to return to the church where they had been baptised, revered as their 'mother church', the place where they became Christians, members of Holy Mother Church. Servants and apprentices living away from home were also given the same day off to visit their mothers, bringing flowers and cake as gifts. They were said to "go a-mothering".

So, the parish church and mothers were the focal point of what was called 'Mothering Sunday'. In the United Kingdom today, the Fourth Sunday of Lent is still known as Mothering Sunday and is observed as Mothers' Day in both the Church and secular society. However, in 1872, in the United States, in the aftermath of the American Civil War and the Franco-Prussian War, a Christian woman called Julia Ward Howe, author of the 'Battle Hymn of the Republic', campaigned for women to take a lead in the cause of world peace. She wanted a special day, June 2nd, set aside each year for this purpose, and for mothers specially to focus on the objective of peace between all nations.

In 1914 her campaign bore fruit. It had been taken up by a fellow American called Anna Jarvis, whose mother had been associated with Julia Howe. Again, it was a time of grave concern for world peace. It was the year the first World War began. The American government, under President Woodrow Wilson, declared that henceforth the second Sunday of May would be known as Mother's Day.

Australians - along with Italy, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, and Turkey and others - observe the American date [although the original Christian commemoration is celebrated in Australia by the Catholic Ordinariate].

Families are the basic unit of our society. They are particularly important in this time of pandemic and uncertainty, and in a world where so many people live under the threat of disease, violence, terrorism and conflict.

The family should be a sanctuary of peace, love and security.

Mothers are at the heart of every Christian home — among other things, teaching and guiding their children to trust in God's love and Providence in these difficult times.

Now, more than ever, is a time for us to thank our mothers for their love and to pray for them. Today we commend all mothers, both living and departed, to the loving and motherly care of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and the mother of us all who bear the name of Christ.

We pray for all mothers: for their happiness and wellbeing and for the gift of peace. May they continue to find joy in caring for and nurturing their children, especially in the Christian way of life. And may their children always show them the appreciation and love they deserve.

Our Lady, Mother of our Saviour, pray for all mothers!
