Dear Parishioners,

While we have entered into stage 4 restrictions please be aware that our Sunday and Wednesday Masses will still be streamed online, and Funeral Masses with no more than 10 mourners are permissible. Unfortunately Baptisms and Weddings are not to take place until further notice. At this time priests are only permitted to provide Holy Communion (Viaticum) and Anointing of the Sick to parishioners in grave mortal danger.

Our Deacon Simeon was contacted by the Seminary Rector during the week informing him, along with the other deacons, that their ordination to the priesthood is postponed. The new date is yet to be decided. Please keep him and all the other deacons and seminarians in your prayers.

One message that is being spoken about often is the need for people to remain in contact with others. It is a very challenging time for people who are isolated to feel connected to others. If you know of anyone in these circumstances please call them or let us know at the presbytery and we will make a 'Pastoral Phone Call'. Furthermore the Cells of Evangelisation have extended an invitation for anyone who would like to join them for a cells meeting at any time. All the contact details are listed below. #### SAINT WHO?

#### Blessed Artemide Zatti

Religious (+ 1951) Feast: 15 March

A native of Reggio Emilia in northern Italy, Artemide emigrated with his family to Argentina as a boy. He worked in a tile factory and then entered the Salesian seminary. After helping to care to for a sick priest in the infirmary, Artemide became gravely ill with tuberculosis. He was sent one hundred miles away to the mountain air of Viedma, where Father Evaristo Garrone staffed a small mission hospital. Father Garrone suggested to Artemide that he pray to the Blessed Virgin, promising his life in service to the poor if he should be cured. When the prayer was answered, Artemide left off his seminary studies, took vows as a Salesian brother, and began to serve in the hospital. Two years later, Father Garrone died, and Artemide became head of the hospital and pharmacy. For the next thirty-eight years, he served the poor of Viedma day in and day out, without holiday or break. He slept only five hours each night, and travelled everywhere on bicycle. A contemporary said that he was "not only a provider of medicine, but. ...a medicine for others by his presence, his songs, his voice". At the age of seventy, Artemide fell from a ladder as he was attempting to repair a leaky water tank on the hospital roof. During his recovery, his doctors discovered that he had advanced liver cancer. He died a few months later, already accounted a saint.

Loving Father, through the intercession of Blessed Artemide Zatti, so transform me that those who see me are drawn to you.
