Saint Who?

Saints Who Renewed Parish Life Saint Maria Soledad Torres Acosta (Foundress) Feast: 11th October

Manuela was the second of five children born to a Spanish family of modest means. Of a thoughtful, generous nature, she wanted to enter the Dominicans. But a Servite priest leading a nearby parish convinced her to take a different path. Having struggled to provide for his parishioners who were too sick to even go to the hospital, the priest had begun to gather young women to nurse them in their own homes. Though frail herself, Manuela joined the group, becoming Maria Soledad, "Mary Desolate," after the Mother of Sorrows.

At first, the putrid wounds of the sick repulsed Maria. Little by little, she came to see Christ in each person she served. Five years passed, and the priest who had recruited Maria took six of the women to Africa to start a new community, leaving her alone to lead the sisters in Madrid. The women were as poor as those they served, and often had only bread to eat. When vicious rumours about Maria were spread, the work seemed to be in jeopardy. In the nick of time, powerful friends including the queen of Spain herself - came to the rescue.

The order came to be called the Handmaids of Mary Serving the Sick. Maria told them: "Do not be so anxious about a house on earth when we have such a beautiful one in heaven. We are poor, but charity compels us. We must share what God gives us among his poor."

Eternal Father, through the intercession of Saint Maria Soledad Torres Acosta, help me to see the poor and the sick in the midst. Give me the strength to help them.

Saint Who? Saints Who Renewed Parish Life

Saint Joseph Cafasso

(Priest) Feast: 23rd June

Joseph came from Castelnuovo d'Asti in Piedmont, Italy. He went to the seminary and was ordained in 1833 at the unusually young age of twenty-two. Joseph's slight build and twisted spine did not prevent the rector of the Institute of Saint Francis from seeing Joseph's evident gifts; he asked Joseph to teach moral theology only four months after his ordination.

Joseph had a powerful influence over the country boys who came to Turin to be formed into priests. After meeting Joseph, a fourteen-vear-old John Bosco immediately declared him "a saint!" Joseph gave spiritual direction to John Bosco for twenty-five years and formed many others in the essentials of priestly life: prayer, preaching and catechesis. A deeply committed confessor himself, Joseph mentored young would-be-confessors, teaching them to draw souls gently but persistently to Christ. Citing Joseph's witness at the end of the Year for Priests in 2010, Pope Benedict XVI affirmed that Joseph's ministry was a real "school of priestly holiness."

Joseph carried on a prison ministry that amazed his contemporaries. He seemed never to tire of visiting men who suffered in wretched conditions. He accompanied over fifty penitent convicts to their executions, his "hanged saints." After Joseph died in 1860, John Bosco penned his biography.
