- Compose a short paragraph or two (no more) using the points below
- Sign off and include your full name and postal address (most important)

Points you can make:

- No matter what terminology we may use; euthanasia is homicide and assisted suicide is what it says it is.
- We should never condone killing people as a response to suffering we can do better than that!
- Caring should never involve deliberate ending of a life.
- The law as it stands protects all Victorians. Euthanasia & assisted suicide means that some will be protected more than others; that some people may be deemed 'better off dead'!
- Make palliative care the priority of government so that everyone can have a death with real dignity!
- No matter what so-called 'safeguards' are included, euthanasia & assisted suicide are never safe there is no safe way to prematurely end a life!

TALKING POINTS ON ASSISTED SUICIDE AND EUTHANASIA

While the specific form of the proposed Victorian legislation is not yet known, there are some general principles about such legislation that should be of concern to us all.

When people write or talk to their members of parliament or discuss this issue with their friends, it is helpful to have a few 'talking points' that reflect these concerns. Think about the following points and consider using them in your own words. You need not use them all. Focus on the ones that mean the most to you.

• I'm concerned that euthanasia is about actively killing someone and assisted suicide is helping someone to suicide.

The use of euphemisms in the debate such as 'assisted dying' and 'dying with dignity' have the tendency to disguise the obvious. Ever since laws were first formulated, the prohibition on citizens killing each other or helping others to their suicide deaths has been maintained. Even though the context of people suffering from serious illness demands that we want to see their suffering relieved, it is not necessary or desirable that we do this by actively taking their lives.

• I'm concerned that a government that struggles to get trains to run on time can run a system for killing people that is failsafe.

While governments do their best, mistakes and failures happen. That is why Victoria removed the death penalty – innocent people can and do die. The risk of someone being killed because of a failure in the system is too great. It is impossible to do this safely.

• I'm concerned that vulnerable people will be coerced to decide to be killed.

People who are vulnerable because of advanced age, illness, disability or by a combination of all three, may feel that they are a burden on their families and their finances. How can we ever be totally sure that a vulnerable person made a decision for euthanasia or assisted suicide without some duress or even their own diminished sense of self-worth?

• I'm concerned that euthanasia and assisted suicide provide an opportunity for elder abuse.

Elder Abuse is abuse of an elderly person. It can be for financial gain but more serious physical and emotional abuse are also noted. Elder abuse is said to affect up to 10% of the Australian population of people over the age of 65. It is not difficult to imagine someone either 'volunteering' for assisted suicide or euthanasia because of a lack of self-worth or even to escape abuse. It is also possible that the control that abusers exercise over such elderly people may be a factor that is difficult to uncover.

• I'm concerned that this sends a mixed and dangerous message to anyone at risk from suicidal depression – especially the young.

Our society rightly promotes suicide prevention initiatives that say quite clearly to vulnerable people that their lives are worth living. Euthanasia and assisted suicide says the opposite. It should be of great concern to us all that we are offering prevention for some section of our community and support for suicide to others. Young people will see the contradiction here.

ullet 1'm concerned about people living with disability and the negative messages that euthanasia & assisted suicide send.

While people with a disability may believe they ought to receive the supports needed to enjoy a life with dignity, they also fear that assisted suicide and euthanasia may be seen as a way out of difficulties they (and their carers) face on a daily basis. Think about what it would be like to regularly be told "if I had that disability, I'd rather be dead". Their lives are challenging enough without adding that burden.
