Dear Parishioners

When we reflect upon the birth of Our Lord we naturally are drawn to feelings of light, happiness and peace. Yet at the same time there is a tension that also runs through the Christmas Story. We hear Zechariah in the temple is unable to believe he and his wife will have a child and is struck dumb for his unbelief. Our Lady wonders how can this come about since I am a virgin, in response to the Angel Gabriel's announcement. St Joseph is so overwhelmed by the daunting task of being the spouse to the Mother of God that he decided to divorce Mary, until an angel directs him otherwise. At the time of Christ Jesus birth his parents have to travel an arduous journey only to find a safe place for the child's birth cannot be found. Only a stable will do. And as for a crib—a manger—an animal's feeding bowl. And then to add another level of danger, Herod in a murderous rage wants to kill the new born King as he slaughters innocent children. At the presentation of Christ in the temple Simeon tells Mary 'a sword will pierce your soul too'. Although we have this background of risk, danger and tension, God Our Heavenly Father providentially guides Zechariah, Elizabeth, Mary and Joseph through all of the uncertainties and imminent perils to safety.

To some extent we have been living with a new tension over the better part of the last two years. We are well aware of fear, anxiety, illness and sadly deaths that people and families have experienced. Yet by the same taken God our Heavenly Father is well aware of our situation and by trusting him, and keeping faith in him as the parents of Christ did, as they welcomed Jesus into their lives, we too can take recourse in the firm foundation of our faith that God is with us. He is part of our lives. He is born into our hearts. He shares in every aspect of our lives. And most importantly he will bring a resolution to all things. So we must keep faith in Him and trust he is in command of all things.



Finally may I thank all of our parishioners for their ongoing support of our parish in so many different ways. It is because of your faithful and constant support we are able to look forward to our future with a true sense of hope.
