+ The Melbourne Cup, the Race that stops a Nation and truly the Sport of Kings.

The long weekend is now over - always the first weekend in November and many people have a comfortable smile still lingering as a 'local' wins a horse race that is certainly becoming harder to achieve because of the strong international contenders.

David Burke was the VRC chairman who took this famous race to the world in 1992, and since then, the Irish, the United Arab Emirates, Americans & Asians have shaken up the odds of an Australian horse being able to win this race against such a strong field. But, 'Vow and Declare' trained by Danny O'Brien - ridden by Jockey Craig Williams and owned by a tribe of locals from Gympie are still celebrating this wonderful win of the 159th Melbourne Cup. This win was the 'first' for all involved, and that is what I think makes this a very special story and a wonderful result! Only 2 horses out of the field of 24 were home grown - besides living in Eltham & Montmorency, I wish I was living in Gympie in the past week! What a local party.

+ Remembrance Day, at 11am on 11 November 1918, the guns on the Western Front fell silent after 4 years of continuous warfare. This was the first modern world conflict and had brought about the mobilisation of some 100 million people - in its day - from many countries and while the number of dead remains a mystery in its exact terms, the list is over 12 million. So, now we have just past the first 100 years - Centenary, yet we must continue to remember. Today, Remembrance Day recalls all those young women and men who have died in wars, not just the Great War or WWII, but every conflict since then and even in the theatre of war today! The 'red poppy' is a symbol of Remembrance and hope for a peaceful world with a positive future. Poppies are worn as a show of support for our Armed Forces community, those currently serving, veterans and their families. Not a bad reason for wearing a Poppy on Monday!



+ Today's Gospel - how to explain the reality of the Resurrection. Now that's an easy topic for Philosophers & Theologians, I think easier to back a winner in the Cup or avoid a religious war than to attempt to explain this reality! All three synoptic gospels pose this question - thus its importance. Easter Sunday expresses this Mystery the best as the human desire becomes fully alive! If we believe in God at all, than a concept that God is Eternal and thus as human beings we are somehow linked to this infinite Being is plausible. 'Finite Beings participating in the Infinite Being' that's Karl Rahner's view, and I love it. Jesus as the Son of God, is the first to show the way and ultimately this faith position is one that I can accept. So the last line of today's Gospel passage reads: "Now He is God, not of the Dead, but of the Living, for in Him all people are in fact alive." Luke: 20:38.

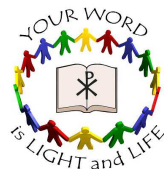

Parish meeting on the 'Listen and Discern' phase of Plenary Council 2020

In last week's *Monty & Eltham* we announced that a small group of parishioners had met with Fr. Terry in the Parish house to consider how we might respond to the Listen and Discern phase of preparations for the Plenary Council 2020. The group chose two of the themes or 'Callings' for the Church, outlined in the Reports on the first phase, for reflection and discussion in a parish meeting to which all are invited. The Callings were:

1. The Calling to be a Church that is: Inclusive, Participatory, and Synodal
2. The Calling to be a Church that is Joyful, Hope-filled, and a Servant community.

The group has devised an interesting agenda for the meeting, to include reflection on two relevant Gospel passages and discussion of how our Church might better realise these Callings.

Materials for the meeting (a couple of pages) will be made available over the next fortnight. More on them, and further information, will be provided in next week's *Monty and Eltham*. Here are some basics:

- We will meet on Monday 25 November at 7.30 in the Parish Hall.
- Participants will be asked to choose which of the two Callings they would most like to consider.

Gospel: Luke 20:27-38

Some Sadducees - those who say that there is no resurrection - approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?'

Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.'



Let's Get Creative

At a retreat, two teams were given the task of getting from point A to point B on a huge Twister-like grid. The rules were very specific about what moves forward, backward, and sideways were legal and what weren't. It was very apparent that a straight run by every team member would not do the trick.

After much deliberation, one team finally figured out the key to getting across the mat. They would simply hold hands. The rules never said that every team member had to get across the mat, it simply said the team must reach the other side following very specific guidelines, which, in the end, did not allow for individual achievement, only a collective effort.

Creative thinking is often what the most difficult problems require, as Jesus so artfully shows us in this week's gospel. The usual tactics and strategies won't do. In fact, doing what's always been done is what most often gets us into trouble. If we want to know what it will be like to live in God's realm, then we must begin by not trying to measure it by human standards. Asking "*What would Jesus do?*" was all the rage a few years ago but remains a very good question. Whatever it is, it won't be something we can calculate, control, or measure. It will likely surprise, challenge, and be a response generated by love and connection.
