The Feast of the Epiphany

While the hustle and bustle of Christmas ends for many people on Dec 26, (Boxing Day) throughout Christian history Christmas lasts for twelve days – all the way until Jan 6.

This feast marking the end of Christmas is called "Epiphany".

In the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church, Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus was the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but also in his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana. This powerful feast in the church's calendar predates the original Christmas feast - Jesus is the light to the whole world. It is a wonderfully rich and disturbing Gospel starting with the outsiders, the wise men from the east following the Star!

The first week of our New Year 2023 has unfortunately been marred by family tragedies, a number of drownings, some terrible car accidents and the collision involving the two helicopters on the Gold Coast. All these traumatic deaths occurring while people were on holidays.

And, this week ended with the historic Funeral Mass for Emeritus Pope Benedict, presided over by a very frail Pope Francis. Might our present Pope move into retirement, continuing the Benedict effect?

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah,

for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Reflection:

Matthew's account of the visit of the Magi has all the ingredients of a gripping drama for stage or screen. Seekers from afar, mysterious signs, corruption at court, unwitting authorities, and a vulnerable target all make for Matthew, however, is not out to an exciting story. entertain his readers but to enlighten them.

He achieves three things at least. He identifies the Christchild as the long-awaited messiah; he anticipates the apostles' mission to preach the good news to all nations (28:19); and he foreshadows the conspiracy that will succeed in executing God's anointed one.

A corollary of Matthew's story-telling success is the wealth of invention it has sparked ever since, especially about the number and identity of the Magi (whom Matthew never names as kings) and about the meaning of the gifts. For all the charm of this creative imagination, Matthew's purpose must not be lost sight of.

Except for allusions in some Christmas carols, today is the only day in the annual cycle of readings that this story is told. Summer holidays may mean smaller congregations, but those who attend would be blessed to hear it proclaimed with flair and preached on with insight.
