Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

Two of the disciples of Jesus were on their way to a village called Emmaus, seven miles from Jerusalem, and they were talking together about all that had happened. Now as they talked this over, Jesus himself came up and walked by their side; but something prevented them from recognizing him. He said to them, 'What matters are you discussing as you walk along?' They stopped short, their faces downcast.

Then one of them, called Cleopas, answered him, 'You must be the only person staying in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have been happening there these last few days.' 'What things?' he asked. 'All about Jesus of Nazareth' they answered 'who proved he was a great prophet by the things he said and did in the sight of God and of the whole people; and how our chief priests and our leaders handed him over to be sentenced to death, and had him crucified. Our own hope had been that he would be the one to set Israel free. And this is not all: two whole days have gone by since it all happened; and some women from our group have astounded us: they went to the tomb in the early morning, and when they did not find the body, they came back to tell us they had seen a vision of angels who declared he was alive. Some of our friends went to the tomb and found everything exactly as the women had reported, but of him they saw nothing.'

Then he said to them, 'You foolish men! So slow to believe the full message of the prophets! Was it not ordained that the Christ should suffer and so enter into his glory?' Then, starting with Moses and going through all the prophets, he explained to them the passages throughout the scriptures that were about himself.

When they drew near to the village to which they were going, he made as if to go on; but they pressed him to stay with them. 'It is nearly evening' they said 'and the day is almost over.' So he went in to stay with them. Now while he was with them at table, he took the bread and said the blessing; then he broke it and handed it to them. And their eyes were opened and they recognized him; but he had vanished from their sight. Then they said to each other, 'Did not our hearts burn within us as he talked to us on the road and explained the scriptures to us?'

They set out that instant and returned to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven assembled together with their companions, who said to them, 'Yes, it is true. The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.' Then they told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognized him at the breaking of bread.



Reflection:

During Lent we heard three splendidly crafted stories from the gospel of John - the woman at the well, the man born blind and the raising of Lazarus. Each one blended human interest with theological intent and made telling use of irony. Luke's account of the Emmaus episode is no less finely composed. It too is humanly appealing, theologically oriented and spiced with irony.

The women who went to the tomb never saw the risen Lord yet believed he was alive, while the two disheartened disciples do see him but fail to believe. When faith finally dawns on them and Jesus vanishes from their sight, we are reminded of Jesus' words to Thomas in last Sunday's gospel: "Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe".

The story contains the basic elements of a catechumenal journey: disorientation, the stirring of faith, an openness to enlightenment, discovery and belief, and the impulse to share. It can also be seen through a liturgical lens. There's a sequence of gathering, breaking open the word, sharing the sacrament and sending forth.

What matters here is that Luke has left us a story that engages us deeply and holds our attention. We can readily imagine ourselves to be those disciples, sharing each stage of their experience. It should be a joy for the minister of the word to proclaim and heart-warming for the assembly to hear.

The TLC members, from both SFX & OLHC parishes, have been working over the past 2 years bringing together the combined 'stories' of these two Faith communities with the ultimate aim of creating a new parish name and identity by:

Dear Father Michael Sierakowski,

My prayerful greetings to you.

Thank you for your letter and documentation dated 1 December 2022, seeking my approval for the amalgamation of the Parishes of St Francis Xavier, Montmorency and Our Lady Help of Christians, Eltham - to create a new parish. I was glad to hear of the process of consultation undertaken with the faith communities and the commitment to meet the needs of a new local parish community and to deepen its heart in the Gospel.

I do apologise for the delay in this response. As you will be aware, there were consultative steps that I needed to take before giving a determination. In particular, it is required that I consult the Council of Priests (can. 515§2) and the College of Consultors before making any changes to the status of a parish.

I am now pleased to advise you that following the above-mentioned consultations held, I am happy to proceed with the Amalgamation of the Parishes of St Francis Xavier, Montmorency and Our Lady Help of Christians, Eltham.

However, before this is announced to the Parish communities, I ask that a different name be sought. There are several parishes within the Archdiocese under the name of Holy Trinity, and we need to seek some further expressions of unity. If you could provide me with an alternative name that meets the requirements below, I will be happy to issue a Decree of Amalgamation that will take effect 30 days from the date of its issuance. In providing that Decree you will also be given instructions for the lawful notification of the Amalgamation to your people.

Archdiocesan Naming Policy

5.2 The Code of Canon Law provides guidelines for determining how churches are named. The relevant canons are 1214 - 1222. The chosen name of a church can be:

- The name of the Trinity, or
- A name for Christ, invoked in the liturgy, or a mystery of his life, or
- The name of the Holy Spirit, or
- A name for Mary, invoked under a title for her used in the liturgy, or
- The name of a holy angel, or
- The name of a canonised saint, as it appears in the Roman martyrology (or appendix), or
- The name of a Blessed provided the Apostolic See has given its permission.

The aforementioned guidelines can also apply to merging churches/parishes. If several parishes are merged into one, the names of the churches from the former parishes must be retained and the newly merged parish, for pastoral reasons, can adopt a name different from the names of the churches it will inherit. The naming of a new parish can include many elements in terms of research, considerations of the location of the new parish and any particular devotions of parishioners.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for your ongoing ministry in these neighbourhoods of grace, and the work of bringing together these communities of God's people in Montmorency and Eltham. Please be assured of my constant prayers for you and your people.
