Dear Michael,

My prayerful greetings to you.

Thank you for your letter of 28 April 2023, seeking my approval for a new name in furthering the petition for the amalgamation of the Parishes of St Francis Xavier Montmorency and Our Lady Help of Christians Eltham - to become the Parish of the Risen Christ - Montmorency & Eltham.

I have now been able to have final consultation with the Council of Priests (can. 515§2) and the College of Consultors, and am pleased to advise you that following the above-mentioned consultation, I have amalgamated the Parishes of St Francis Xavier Montmorency and Our Lady Help of Christians, Eltham in the new Parish of the Risen Christ, which will take effect from 30 June 2023.

I ask that a copy of the attached Decree be displayed on the Church noticeboard in each of the Churches for one calendar month before that date, and that the matter is to be drawn to the attention of the faithful by the celebrant of the Mass at all parochial Masses in all churches on Saturday evening, 24 June 2023, and Sunday 25 June 2023. It is a requirement that both this letter and the Decree be retained in your Parish Archives. Likewise, copies will be held in the Archdiocesan Archives for both of the parishes.

Thank you for your ongoing ministry in these neighbourhoods of grace, and the work of bringing together these communities of God's people in Montmorency and Eltham. Please be assured of my constant prayers for you and your people.



In 2023, the PFGM celebrates its GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY: 50 years since Passionist Family Groups emerged from the developing Catholic parish of St Anthony of the Fields in Terrey Hills, NSW in 1973. From the initiative of their priest, the late **Fr Peter McGrath CP** of the Passionist Order, he and others set

about preserving the original community spirit when people knew each other by name and shared each other's joys and struggles.

These first 'Family Groups' were such a convincing model of community they eventually formed twenty-six Passionist

Much later, in 1995, fourteen Passionist Family Groups were formed at St Francis Xavier Parish in Montmorency at the initiative

of several enthusiastic parishioners and the then PP, Fr Peter Matheson. Pictured are the original SFX Parish PFGM Coordinators Val and Terry Carrigg. Sadly, they passed



away within weeks of each other in 2008.

In 2023, there are six active Passionist Family Groups in the Montmorency Parish. These groups are made up of both original and later members who expressed interest in joining and were warmly welcomed over that time.



The current Montmorency PFGM Parish coordinators, Joan and David Muller, have been parishioners of both the Eltham Parish and Montmorency Parishes over the years.

Joan and David, together with Fr Michael, invite all interested people from both Montmorency and, especially Eltham, to join a Family Group OR if the number of interested new members is large, to form a new Passionist Family Group within Montmorency/Eltham.

What is a Family Group?

A Family Group provides an extended family for all who wish to belong: church-going or not, young or elderly, married, single, separated or divorced: 'A Family for All'.

EVERYONE is welcome to join.

What does a Family Group do?

Ideally, Family Groups gather once a month to enjoy being together, to get to know one another and gradually to develop supportive relationships at gatherings such as a dinner, a picnic/bike ride, barbecue, pizza night, local train trip, quiz night/afternoon, etc.

If children belong to a Family Group, it is suggested that every second month be an adults-only gathering so that the adults can get to know each other well.

Some Family Groups enjoy an annual weekend away together.

Joining a Passionist Family Group could be for you:

- Would you like to meet regularly with others in caring, social situations to build the bonds of Christian friendship?
- Are you new to this Parish?
- Have you no immediate family or friends nearby?
- Do you want to involve your child/children in your Christian sharing directly, if possible? If not, then indirectly by your example?
- Have your circumstances changed since you moved into the Parish: Retirement? Death of a partner? Children moved away?

Many Family Group activities revolve around hospitality and the simpler these events are, the more enjoyable they can be.

Passionist Priest, Fr Brian Traynor CP, emphasises that keeping things simple (and inexpensive) helps to preserve the essence of the Passionist Family Group Movement, especially in relation to hospitality.

Fr Brian writes:

'Most people live 'ordinary' lives and they can be reached by 'ordinary' people. We just need to invite people to get together and let them know that it's nothing special – other than they are contributing to the event! There is no need to think of complex Family Group functions to organise – just open your home! Remember Jesus included in his call to invite the poor and needy- the ones who can't repay you.'

The call is to 'reach out'.

Ideally, over time, this comes naturally within a Passionist Family Group.

Nearby parishes with Family Groups include: Diamond Creek, Greensborough, Mill Park, Lalor, Templestowe, Donvale, Doncaster East. The PFGM motto " A Family for All" continues to live on in 143 Catholic Parishes throughout Australia!




The Montmorency Craft Group celebrates our 20th Birthday during June.




To the parishioners of SFX and the families at SFX and HT primary schools, we would like to share with you our <u>Annual Report from St Vincent de Paul (SVDP) Montmorency Conference</u> for the period 1 May 2022 to 30 April 2023

This is the **190th anniversary of the founding of St Vincent de Paul (SVDP) in Paris by Frederic Ozanam**. It is also the **58th year of our parish church and of the Montmorency (SVDP) conference**. We assist people in Lower Plenty, Montmorency, Briar Hill, St Helena and Eltham North. Home visitation is at the heart of SVDP mission & vision and as such seeks to be recognized as a caring Catholic organization offering *a 'hands up' to people in need in our local community* irrespective of their faith, ethnicity, social background, gender or political opinions. We do this, on your behalf, by respecting their dignity and privacy, sharing our hope for them and *encouraging them to take control of their own destiny*. We are inspired by the joy of the Gospels and our Catholic social teachings to do things that matter. The spirit to feed, heal, shelter, nurture, and inspire – the power to change lives – is in everyone.

Findings from multiple studies show that women are at an increased likelihood of homelessness due to domestic & family violence, economic inequality, and inadequate income support payments which entrench poverty and disadvantage. The current cost-of-living crisis is an additional driver with everything from housing, food, utilities and day-to-day essentials placing women at heightened risk of homelessness and insecurity.

Support from Schools and Parishioners

SVDP Montmorency is most grateful and thankful to our supporters: SFX parishioners, our two parish primary schools - Holy Trinity (HT) and St Francis Xavier (SFX) and Catholic Ladies College (CLC), through your support of our appeals. We are entirely dependent on the generosity of the SFX parishioners and the school communities.



Over the past year, your conference assisted 189 adults (32 more than the previous year) and 154 children (8 more than the previous year) by providing support, friendship, material assistance and advice about accessing government, health and financial services. In addition, we also visited 37 families with Christmas hampers and gifts.

Although our resources are continually being stretched we were, thanks to your generosity, able to **provide assistance to the value of \$ 25,948 over the twelve months to April 2023**. Below is a summary of how we have provided material assistance to people in need in the Montmorency/Briar Hill/Lower Plenty/St Helena/Eltham North areas-

SFX Grade 1 response to the Creation Story

The children from Grade 1 listened to the story of Creation in Godly Play form. We had a small discussion in the church. The children were encouraged to pick out what they would like to thank God for, in particular, from the seven days of Creation. Here are their artistic responses (more to follow next week!):



Gospel: John 3:16-18

Jesus said to Nicodemus, 'God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.'



Reflection:

The holy Spirit has often been called the forgotten person of the Holy Trinity. Ironically, today's set of readings seems to reinforce this perception. The first reading reveals the name of the one God. The gospel's primary focus is on God's Son. This means that the only reference to the Holy Spirit today is in the last breath of the second reading. Earlier verses from chapter three of John's gospel that refer to being born of the Spirit are not heard.

Recent Johannine scholarship, however, has discerned the presence of a wisdom or "Sophia" tradition throughout the gospel. Time and again, Jesus can be seen as the embodiment of the wisdom that features prominently in several books of the Old Testament. There, wisdom is generally a feminine figure who makes God's creating, redeeming and judging work present in the world. This is what today's gospel attributes explicitly to God's Son, and perhaps implicitly to Sophia.

Of the gospel's three sentences, the first two make strong positive assertions about God's purpose in sending his Son, namely to have eternal life and to be saved. After these encouraging declarations, the third sentence is quite downbeat. Those who refuse to believe, it says, condemn themselves. Ministers of the word would be right to give primary emphasis to the two affirmations and only secondary attention to the final words of warning. **Break Open the Word 2023**
