## Jesus at the Well.

This image is in the cloister at Chester Cathedral, England, depicting the meeting of Jesus with the Samaritan woman.

There is a wonderful encounter between the both of them. First we note that Samaritans and Jews did not associate with each other, and the disciples on their return high-

light this. Jesus reveals to the woman his knowledge of her life and that he indeed is the Messiah. She acknowledges that the Messiah is coming and eagerly she returns to her village to inform them that she has found the Christ.

The imagery of water is also very powerful here, for it gives life not only now but for all eternity. Obviously the woman is eager to receive Christ.

We might ask ourselves are we prepared to listen to what Jesus offers to us and echo the words of the Samaritans.

**Entrance Antiphon:** My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

**Responsorial Psalm:** If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Gospel Acclamation: Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! Lord, you are truly the Saviour of the world; give me living water, that I may never thirst again. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

**<u>Communion Antiphon:</u>** For anyone who drinks it, says the Lord, the water I shall give will become in him a spring welling up to eternal life.

### Explore the possibilities

#### **LENT**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence from meat.

On all other Fridays, except solemnities, the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing any one of the following:

**Prayer** - for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary; or in other ways.

**Self-Denial** - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere; or in other ways. Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our self-denial in Australia.

**Helping Others** - for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened; or in other ways.

- All who have completed their eighteenth year and have not yet begun their sixtieth year are bound to fast. All who have completed their fourteenth year are bound to abstain (Canon 1252).
