The Generosity of our Loving God

It may seem difficult for us to believe that God is a perfect forgiver, if we can use that term. Sometimes we find it very hard to forgive completely and permanently. We recall the words of Jesus as he hung dying on the cross, "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing". Yet this does not mean that the offender is not responsible for his or her actions. There is a difference between forgiveness and taking responsibility. Responsibility may mean some form of punishment for inappropriate actions. The parable Jesus shares with us is very clear. Peter suggests seven as an example for the number of times one should forgive (seven is seen as the perfect number). Jesus takes this much further. There is something important here for us to remember. We must take responsibility for our actions. When we treat others with disrespect we have a responsibility to acknowledge our wrong doing. As well we are to forgive in the spirit of the words of Jesus, "Love one another as I have loved you". Here then is the challenge, we may not agree with the actions of another, but it is an error to hate and not forgive. This does not take away the responsibility of the offender to make amends or make restitution.
