# Forgiveness

The parable of the father and his two sons expresses the loving embrace of the father without judgement. We might ask ourselves what is Jesus trying to say to us as we listen to this parable? Looking at the story we experience the relationship of the father to his two sons. At the request of having half the inheritance now, one of the sons takes off to have a wonderful time and ends up with nothing. The only reason he heads back home is because he knows his father is just, honest and treats his servants with respect. The other son complains and the father points out to him it was only right to welcome his other son home for he was 'dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found'.

We see no condemnation, we see no judgment. We see only acceptance and forgiveness. Perhaps Jesus is reminding us that this is the way the Father welcomes us without condemnation, without judgement, for he recognizes our weaknesses.

The preamble to this parable reminds us that Jesus was accused of eating with tax collectors and sinners, who were shunned and despised, yet for Jesus these were the ones he welcomes and embraces. May we use the example of the father as a our way to welcome the sinner as we know God welcomes us.
