The parable of Jesus about the invitations sent out to come to the wedding feast certainly is a reminder for us all to think about our response to Jesus' invitation to come and share his offerings. It is so easy for us all today to not really consider our response. We know that there are many who have received invitations yet do not bother to reply, let alone come to share the gift of the Eucharist, Jesus himself, given so freely.

As we think of those who have 'other more important things to do' may we be an example to them of our recognition of what a wonderful sustaining offering that is placed before us.

After a pleasant holiday in Italy, travelling from Rome to Capri, Naples, Stromboli and with some travels in between I have been at the North American College in Rome for the past month. Our studies have focussed on St Paul in his scripture writings, Cannon Law review, preaching the Scriptures, the new Roman Missal in a liturgical context (with little appreciation from the presenter on our difficulty with the translations) and Social outreach to the poor. We went to Assisi last week for a retreat. Fortunately we have weekends free which means that I have had the opportunity to explore places around Italy including Spoleto, Orvieto, Tivoli as well as appreciating Rome itself. There is certainly something great about the food in Italy, and to find a good gelato shop is satisfying. Since I have been here the weather has been wonderful, warm days and now cooler evenings and the humidity has gone.
