

What do you think?

"If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her". Interesting words in our Gospel today as Jesus confronts the Pharisees, remembering that they consider themselves better than anyone else.

During these final Lenten days have you taken time to consider how judgmental we might be? It is so easy to blame the other. It is so easy to find fault in the other. Our Gospel today is a challenge offered by Jesus to stop and take a look at ourselves. We note that Jesus does not condemn and simply says, do not sin again.

Perhaps, Paul, in his letter to the Philippians has a thought for each of us as he recognises his own weaknesses:

"All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain for what I still come: I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus."

Paul reminds us of the loving support and guiding hand he finds in the Gospel, which supports his faith. We can also forget the past and live for the future.
