## Slaves of God or slaves of Money!

All of us must contribute to the broader human society. As we look around the world today it is easy for us to note that there are unjust and selfish attitudes in caring for the well being of all people.

Mostly, we know, what causes this imbalance is the dependency and attention to money rather than the well being of all citizens. The saying, 'money is the root of all evil', is most apt as re reflect upon the Gospel today (Luke 16:1-3). Jesus reminds us, 'And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own? 'No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second, or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.'

When our focus is balanced then we see a need to make sure we share our gifts with others and not seek to build our own empire at the expense of others.
