Jesus reminds us of his sacrifice

These words of Jesus in our Gospel today, 'unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies, it remains only a single grain; but if it dies it yields a rich harvest', speak of the sacrifice Jesus himself is to make.

These words though are more than just related to Jesus. They are words for each one of us. Everyone of us makes sacrifices, we are prepared to give so others will have life. Perhaps the only difference between Jesus and ourselves is that we are not prepared to give so fully and totally. Take a look at your life. Yes, I'm sure you make lots of sacrifices, yet at the same time have limitations. When we take a look at ourselves, which Lent offers us the opportunity to do, we can honestly say that we are not perfect givers. We therefore turn to Jesus as an example and listen to his words in our Gospel today.

Let us pray that we will strive to imitate Christ in the way we give and the way we love. Think of yourself as the grain of wheat which gives of itself to produce a rich harvest, a selfless focus rather than an inward desire for self.
