### BREAKFAST BRIEFING: POPE FRANCIS AND THE CARE OF OUR COMMON HOME

Friday 31 July, 7.15am for a 7.30am start, finish 8.45am Cathedral Room, Cardinal Knox Centre. 383 Albert Street, East Melbourne. Pope Francis has published his long-awaited encyclical Laudato Si' on our relationship with the whole of creation. The encyclical places the care of creation, our 'common home', at the heart of Christian theology. He calls on our fragile world to leave behind the myth of unlimited material progress and proposes instead a 'sense of fraternity that excludes nothing and no one' and an understanding of the Earth as a 'shared inheritance'. Catholic Earthcare Australia has provided a list of main themes of the encyclical and some practical actions for us all. Joseph Camilleri, an emeritus professor from La Trobe University, and Andrew Hamilton SJ have written insightful local initial reviews of the encyclical for our reflection. ## Food for the Journey

From the Book of Kings we listen to the account of Elisha feeding the crowd with twenty barley loaves and being questioned as to how so many could feed so many from a small amount of bread. We note that there was bread left over, 'for the Lord says, "They will eat and have some left over."

We also note a parallel within our Gospel today when Jesus feeds the crowd from five barley loaves and two fish. There is an obvious link to this Old Testament account for, 'The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, "This really is the prophet who is to come into the world."

Contained with in this account it is also important to note that Jesus and his friends needed time to get away form the business of daily events. We need to do the same and find time for reflection and revitalization in the business of our lives. Yet within all of this we see Jesus offering himself to us as. May we reflect on how are also respond to those who seek our support.
