# Love is a Gift

Last week we reflected on ourselves as God's gift and belonging to him, yet within this God also offers us freedom. Because the Sadducees and Pharisees were not content with the challenges that Jesus placed in their way, once again we hear how they tried to disconcert him.

Every parent loves their child, implicitly and without question, for they see their child as their own. Yet at the same time recognise the independence and uniqueness of the person in their arms. God likewise sees us so. It is with these thoughts in mind that Jesus is able to come back to the Sadducee with his most profound reflection. It is not just an invitation, for Jesus says you 'must'. It is a requirement that is placed upon us, like so many other requirements that are placed upon us. It is 'how' we respond that makes the difference. If we love because we have to do so, then is it really love? Jesus truly invites us to reflect upon the greatest gift that he is able to offer to us. We likewise think of the ways in which we give ourselves to those around us.

November is a special time to pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a church on 2 November and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions. (From the official ORDO of the Catholic Church)

Indulgence: The remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sin whose guilt has already been forgiven. A properly disposed member of the Christian faithful can obtain an indulgence under prescribed conditions through the help of the Church, which as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints. An indulgence is partial if it removes part of the temporal punishment due to sin, or plenary if it removes all punishment. (From the Catechism of the Catholic Church)
