Do we really listen?

When things are not the way we want we resist. Listen to the encounter in our Gospel this weekend. Peter does not like what he hears. Peter strives to change the direction in the life and passage of Jesus: His purpose in coming amongst us. Look at your own life. Do you also do this to others? Do you want at the expense of considering the needs of the other? Yes we often say that it's ok to change as long as I do the changing.

The challenge that Jesus puts out goes like this: "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me." Jesus is telling us to put aside the desire to satisfy oneself. Give rather than receive. I think we all know that we are happiest when we are giving of ourselves, when we are there for the other. We are saddest when we focus only upon ourselves. This is a reminder that we are called to be listeners and not tellers. Peter wanted to tell Jesus, because Peter was thinking about what he wanted rather than what Jesus was saying.
