### **SEAFARERS SUNDAY**

In our daily lives, we are surrounded by and use many objects and products that at some stage of their journey towards us have been transported on vessels. On Sea Sunday we are invited to recognise and express our gratitude to this force of more than 1.5 million seafarers, who with their hard work and sacrifices are making our life more comfortable by transporting, between nations and across the seven seas, almost 90 per cent of the goods.

### **REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL**

The whole of this Parables Sermon is read over the next three Sundays, and it makes up the discourse element of this unit of the Year of Matthew. In today's gospel we read almost half of the whole sermon which comprises the Parable of the Sower (at the beginning and end of the passage) along with the 'explanation' of why Jesus spoke in parables. While most of today's reading is also found in Make and Luke, Matthew is a fuller text and makes is clear that the focus is on how many heard Jesus but were un-affected by him. For Matthew the reason that many did not (or do not) hear Jesus, and why Jesus will only speak in parables is inter-connected: the kingdom is a mystery which is both seen and hidden. At one extreme there are those for whom it is a silly irrelevance, while to others it is the gateway to a great harvest.

### Reflections from St Kevin's School Principal, Frances Matisi's, recent trip to Ireland.

One of the most engaging and challenging speakers we had during our stay in Ireland was **Diarmuid O'Murchu.** So much of what he said resonated with me, made me curious, made me angry, made me think, provoked me and challenged me; but most importantly gave me hope. His time with us made me realise that each of us has our part to play in making our Catholic Church what we need it to be in today's world, if it is to be a relevant and purposeful part of our lives and the lives of future generations. We can't sit back and hope it happens – we need to be active members and make it happen – and Diarmuid believes that indeed we can and that we need to start here at home in our own parish.

Diarmuid challenged us with the notion that the future of our civilisation will be lead by elders, not by the youth. By 2020 our world population will consist of more people over 60 than under 60. He spoke about the need for our Catholic Faith to be an adult faith, where no topic is off limits. When we are told what we can and can't discuss we will never have an adult faith. He went on to say that adult faith development demands dialogue, conversation and engagement – unfortunately this is not always what we get. We need to be brave and to challenge what we see as holding us back in a respectful and adult way. We need to read the scriptures in a way that shows they have meaning for us today – and indeed they do when they are opened up and explored in the way that Diarmuid did with us. He challenged us to question everything we read and take nothing literally – consider the deeper truth, the message that is relevant for us today, in what we are reading.

Diarmuid spoke about the importance of reconnecting with the example of Jesus and being the kind of community that Jesus was on about. Jesus fostered small communities of faith to look after the earth and each other. Jesus was not interested in a hierarchical church and he spoke of a God of compassion, but somehow at times today we seem to be lumped with a God of laws. We are called to "seek first the kingdom" however for the past 2,000 years, steadily over time, we have put the church first. Jesus lived as a person that stood with the marginalised – he didn't just talk about the need to help them – he was in kinship with them, walked with them, ate with them, and he asks us to do the same.
