Reflections from St Kevin's School Principal, Frances Matisi's, recent trip to Ireland.

One of the speakers we had was **Diarmuid O'Murchu**. One of the most powerful parts of Diarmuid's two day presentation for me, was when he spoke about the "Kingdom of God" as the "Companionship of Empowerment". The "Kingdom of God" was a phrase Jesus used all the time and it is important to understand what he meant – however Jesus never defined it. He told stories and parables to help the disciples understand but he didn't tell them – they had to work it out for themselves. Diarmuid shared this interpretation of Jesus' message with us:

*"I do not call you as servants, but as friends, adult co-disciples,
serving and earthing the companionship of empowerment."*

Diarmuid challenged us with what this 'companionship of empowerment' means today. He said it is about:

- Empowering relationships at every level
- Systemic eco justice for planet and people
- Communal networking to confront structural injustice
- Unconditional inclusivity – love even your enemies
- Transpersonal human development
- Scales for empowering discernment
- Discovering the meaning of empowering ritual.

The message is about not focusing on the individual, but engaging with the web of relationships – this is the companionship of empowerment. Our Church must be about communion not about institution.

Did I mention that Diarmuid is a 70+ year old priest, who has no time for clericalism – he told us that less than 1% of the 1.2 billion Catholics in the world are priests. Lay people are the key players in our Church. He scorned a Church that does not empower its followers to develop an adult faith and have open dialogue about issues that are relevant and important in the time we are living. He challenges the authority of those who say there are topics that are off limits eg women as priests – suggesting they are holding back the people of the Catholic faith and keep us as children and not allowing us to grow.

Reflection For This Weekend

Those looking in the scriptures for a clear exposition of doctrine or a systematic moral code are doomed to be disappointed. Such an enterprise is bound to be continually subverted by the variety of traditions, points of view and forms of literature in the Bible. Subversion in fact is the name of the game when Jesus teaches in parables. These are short stories whose aim is to surprise. They appear to be a favourite teaching tool of Jesus'. He engages his listeners' attention with a story that is generally about familiar things such as farming practice or managing a household. But there is a twist along the way, usually at the end. Jesus uses this unexpected turn to undermine his hearers' conventional views about the "the way things are". They are meant to provoke insight into another reality – the kingdom of heaven. Today we begin a series of three readings from the Parable Sermon in Matthew's gospel.

First we are reminded by the prophet Isaiah of the sure power of God's word to effect its purpose.

Then Paul invites us to accept that we are caught up in unfinished process of cosmic rebirth, but we and the whole of creation will ultimately be set free.

Keeping Koorie Kids in an Education of
their Choice**

The second collection for July will go towards this foundation which "opens the doors" of independent schools to indigenous students. It enables them to gain the most out of opportunities available in a range of supportive and excellent independent schools. Opening the Doors Foundation is part of the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry for Victoria. This year emphasis is being placed on leadership opportunities for senior secondary studies in rural areas. In 2016, \$500,000 helped 740 indigenous students including 65 who completed VCE. Every family who applied was support but only 50% of the costs were covered. The largest number of students come from Greater Melbourne. Others come from North Central Victoria, North Western Victoria and Gippsland.
