Liturgy As Great Treasure

It is true that we experience God's Presence in the many circumstances of our daily lives. But surely one of the most sublime ways we experience God's Presence is in the very celebration of liturgy. The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy tells us that in liturgy Christ is present in his word, in the presider, in the assembly and in the eucharistic bread and wine (no. 7). Thus liturgy itself is a great treasure trove of God's Presence. This suggests both a caution and challenge for us in celebrating liturgy.

The caution that we must always keep in mind is that liturgy first and foremost is our entry into the dying and rising of Christ and in that very act of surrender of self we give God praise and thanks. There is sometimes a tendency in liturgy to celebrate in a way that pleases us and, thus, subtly turn liturgy toward ourselves rather than toward God. When we do this we run a risk of misunderstanding God's Presence to us. The challenge is that we must *surrender* to God's action during the liturgy so that we see the many ways God is present in the celebration. It is too easy to let our minds wander or be distracted by restlessness around us or the things we must do when we get home. Liturgy asks of us a singleminded presence to God so that we can experience God's loving and abiding Presence to us. This is liturgy's great treasure: that we celebrate God's Presence to us and among us.

Reflections from St Kevin's School Principal, Frances Matisi's, recent trip to Ireland.

One of the speakers we had was **Diarmuid O'Murchu.** Diarmuid has written many books that I have begun to access and will add to my pile of post sabbatical reading, which may I say I am getting through at a great rate of knots. Here is a snippet of the opening paragraph from his book entitled "Inclusivity: A Gospel Mandate":

Jesus hung out with whores and social outcasts, was remarkably casual about sex, disapproved of the family, urged us to be laid back about property and possessions, warned his followers that they too would die violently, and insisted that the truth kills and divides as well as liberates. He also cursed the self-righteous prigs and deeply alarmed the ruling class."

(I did ask him about the part that says "disapproved of the family" as that disturbed me a little more than the rest – and he said that this referred to our narrow view of immediate family and challenged us to consider all humans as our family and just as important as our own family.)

To me Diarmuid is such a person of Jesus in every way. He is positive, yet provocative. Strong in his faith, but will not be told how to be faithful. Challenges what he believes are mistruths no matter who is professing them, and all the while goes about his business in a gentle and compassionate way, filling people with hope and empowerment. We need more like him leading our church to a positive future.

I will finish with a beautiful quote he shared with us:

"The mission of faith is no longer to convert. It is to transform the world so that every life will have a better chance to live fully, and thus to commune with the source of life. (God)."

Social Justice at St Kevin's Parish Opening the Door Foundation Keeping Koorie Kids in an Education of their Choice

The second collection for July will go towards this foundation which "opens the doors" of independent schools to indigenous students. It enables them to gain the most out of opportunities available in a range of supportive and independent schools. Opening the Doors Foundation is part of the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry for Victoria. This year emphasis is being placed on leadership opportunities for senior secondary studies in rural areas. In 2016, \$500,000 helped 740 indigenous students including 65 who completed VCE. Every family who applied was support but only 50% of the costs were covered. The largest number of students come from Greater Melbourne. Others come from North Central Victoria, North Western Victoria and Gippsland.

For the first two weeks of August all contributions to our second collection will be directed towards St Joseph's Parish in Meredith as Fr Charles Balnaves works tirelessly at raising funds to build a new Church in Bannockburn.
