The Gospel of Mark

In 3 weeks we shall move from the gospel of Matthew to Mark. So for the next few weeks we shall have little snippets to help us all get more out of Mark. Remember, for a fuller understanding, come to Chris Monaghan's talk here on 29th November. Anonymous because of the role of writer seeking to glorify God not self. The Greek is rough – not his mother tongue – probably from the Semitic background. Christianity finally turns to story differing from letters. All story is a proclamation of order out of chaos. "My pain is bearable as long as I can tell the story." Story is the prime generator/source of hope. To tell hope out of hopelessness – proclamation of hope. Have to go down into darkness, chaos. First sound – Spirit of God moved over the waters, darkness. All story orchestration of hioe. They could not take hope for granted. Inserts them into dark, sad story. "Night" He writes for/to/of a community in the grip of pain and faced with the threat of hopelessness. They could no longer take hope for granted. Inserts into a dark, sad story. To read we need to bring our own darkness and hopelessness. This is the prime resource we bring. What is your darkness?
