NB: There will <u>not</u> be a 9.00am Mass at Holy Cross Monastery on Easter Sunday morning.

Whereas Lent is 40 days of simplicity, Easter is 40 days celebrating the extravagance of God. "Lenten milk gives way to Easter cream". Easter is a time to reflect on the mystery of our faith, that what God did in Jesus, God is doing in the lives of God's people (mystagogy). We need to unpack all that we did over the Easter event. The Gospels of Easter help us with this and help us to remember that Easter is not just one day but 7 Sundays (a week of weeks). What we do Easter Day we do all the Sundays of Easter.

The Triduum stands to the year, then as Sunday stands to the week. Sunday is the Lord's Day, the Day of Resurrection, of Eucharist. We need our annual Passover celebration partly as the Jews do, as a reminder, but mostly for the benefit of the emerging church, the newly baptised. After Pentecost, our lives go back to their normal rhythms, never to be normal again.

Reform and Renewal after the Royal Commission: An invitation to a Conversation, 19th April.

In his discussion with Fatima Measham, consulting editor of Eureka Street, after the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Abuse handed down its final report, Francis Sullivan, CEO of the Truth Justice and Healing Council suggested that ordinary, conventional Catholics have been demoralised by the experience which has led to them withdrawing from participation in the Church; that the credibility of Church leaders has declined and that this decline in credibility has been caused by Church leaders themselves. Some have attempted to "deny this history, and they sought to somehow contextualise it as a thing of the past". A new model of leadership is needed, he said, and the Catholic Church needs to use this moment as a stimulus for reform and renewal. Some questions:

Have we fully appreciated the scandal, horror and the extent of what has happened and why it happened?

To what extent is a new, more inclusive leadership model needed?

How do we respond in a way that will lead to real and effective reform?
