The Year In A Nutshell

Our primary guide through the two parts of this year's Ordinary Time is the gospel writer Mark. Iesus' first words in Mark make it clear that from now on time can never be considered "ordinary": "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news," said Jesus (1:14). Every Sunday - indeed every day - is a "day of salvation" (2 Cor 6: 2). Because Mark's is the shortest gospel we read supplementary material from the gospel of John on three occasions - on this Sunday, on Sundays 17-21, and on the last Sunday of the year, the Feast of Christ the King. On the Sundays of Ordinary Time we hear an Old Testament reading (accompanied by a psalm) that in some way relates to the gospel. This year the independent second reading will come from the apostle Paul's letters to the Corinthians and to the Ephesians, from James the apostle, and from the unknown author of the letter to the Hebrews. A rich feast of the word of God lies before us.

New Archbishop Mid Year? The drums are beating that we shall have a new Archbishop before June this year. The process has started. 'The papal nuncio has circulated a *terna* to the bishops and others he chooses to consult. The terna is the short-list of three possible candidates he is considering for recommendation. The nuncio sends his finalised list to the Congregation of Bishops – a department of the Roman bureaucracy.

Further processing by the bureaucrats of that congregation results in a final, prioritised terna that, once approved by the full membership of the congregation, is sent to the pope. The pope has the final say and is known to occasionally parachute in his own choice.' (Eric Hodgens, LaCroix International)

It may be appropriate to observe such periods of silence, for example, before the Liturgy of the Word itself begins, after the First and Second Reading, and lastly at the conclusion of the Homily. 

The New Humanisim in Christ Jesus:

- •We can speak of humanism only from starting point of the centrality of Jesus, finding in him the traits of the true face of the human.
