Rejoicing weekend, but are you free to do so? Liturgy doesn't lie: In today's gospel, John the Baptist testifies to the light "so that all might believe through him". In other words, he was to tell the truth about the light. Today's liturgical texts overflow with joy. "Rejoice" appears in the first and second readings and the responsorial psalm, and the gospel acclamation speaks of "glad tidings". This Sunday is obviously meant to communicate the joy of our faith in Christ the Light. Now take a look around you at Mass at the faces of those present, especially of the liturgical ministers and other parish leaders. Do their faces "testify" to the light, to that joy? Or do they look like the Christians Pope Francis described as those who "have expressions like they're going to a funeral procession rather than going to praise God" (homily in Casa Santa Marta, May 31, 2013)?

The following is an excerpt from Fr Gerry's diary on his visit to Patupat School last year....

"The school has a couple of condemned classrooms and lots of broken concrete steps which would cause great OH&S drama in Australia, but we didn't see any falls or bandages/scratches on the kids. So there is much to be done. They sit 2 or 3 to a desk and don't mind climbing over desks to gather up the front of the classroom – this latter stunned our teachers! They often have 1 exercise book to 2 students - one writes on left side of page, the other on right side. This is supposed to last the whole year, when they run out, they use scrap paper or the teacher buys them paper. They write with pencils or crayons – but it is all pretty primitive. Everywhere we went, we saw signs of gratitude for what St Kevin's has done – water tank, equipment and especially classrooms. These have been built in recent years by Jason, some Aussie tradies and Filipinos."

Free Bale of Straw There is a bale of straw in the alcove at the bottom of the stairs of the church exit that goes directly down to the carpark. If you would like it for your pets, garden, etc then it is yours. It needs to go so please take it!!

- 1) Our sister community at Patupat
- 2) The extraordinary orphanage work and more carried out by Charity Graf and her team at "Gentle Hands".

WHY SUPPORT GENTLE HANDS
