He asks for the sight of one who truly believes and to whom the truth of Jesus is revealed. In this way, he is a model to all who would be disciples.



### **Our Plenary Council Journey**

Our Parish took several significant steps this week on the journey of the Plenary Council.

- Our Finance Committee became our 10<sup>th</sup> group to look at "What is the Holy Spirit asking of Australia?" In a remarkable synergy they came up with almost all of the issues that came to light in the other 9 sessions.
- 2) An inspiring and broad cross-section of 45 parishioners met on Wednesday. We strongly endorsed 7 of the 8 issues so far submitted to the Plenary Council Committee. There was caution expressed concerning the issue of change with liturgy. This proved that the group was taking seriously the need to listen to each other's Holy Spirit speaking from within. The main concern amounts to insuring the central challenges of liturgy are faced and the peripherals do not dominate.
- 3) 4 of our 45 were from neighbouring parishes wishing to gain insights for their people. The hard work of putting substance into our submissions now begins. St Kevin's had contact with Montmorency, Grovedale, Syndal and Parkdale Parishes. Are we seeing the start of a joint statement?
- Survey Monkey continues to offer those who can't/don't want to come to meetings an opportunity to have a voice. Are you one of those? Check out the survey on our website.
- 5) 2 other initiatives are in the pipeline:
  a) change.org and b) videocam statements to Plenary. Sincere thanks to Lucy Halliburton, Peter Sheehan and Tony Byrne – our driving forces.
