Preparation for the Plenary Council will take place over a period of three years. The Plenary Council will be celebrated in 2020 across two sessions, in October 2020 and May 2021. The national timeline is as follows:

<u>2018</u>: "Year of Listening" (local listening and dialogue sessions and data compilation)

June 2018 – Ash Wednesday 2019: Listening and Dialogue Phase

- <u>2019</u>: "Year of Discerning" (summary reports from 2019 written up as agenda for 2020)
- <u>2020</u>: "Year of Proposing" (two Plenary Council sessions October 2020 and May 2012, at which proposals will be voted on).
