

Who can participate in the listening and dialogue sessions?

Every community in every parish, Catholic primary and secondary schools, Catholic agencies, religious institutes and ecclesial movements are invited to participate. In addition, where possible we are encouraged to reach out to as many people in the Catholic community as possible to enable all to offer a response to the Plenary question: What is God asking of us in Australia at this time?

How is a Plenary Council different from a Synod?

Both gatherings can be influential for the Church. A Plenary Council is the highest form of gathering of local Church and has legislative and governance authority. The decisions that are made at the Council become binding for the Catholic Church in Australia. A Synod does not have this legislative and governance authority.

Serving Without Counting The Cost

In many ways, liturgists and music coordinators really do follow Jesus' call from today's gospels: "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9: 35). There is so much that we do and not for any gain or praise. Much of what we do to prepare an assembly for liturgy is never seen: hours of rehearsing; long nights spent at the computer and the photocopier creating and preparing worship aids; the endless phone calls and emails to volunteers, committee members and staff persons so that everyone can be on the same page. And, in an ironic twist to this Scripture passage, we are often the first and the last to be at the church, just so the assembly can focus simply on praying well. So today, thank a minister for their service (don't forget the data people).
