



to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages." Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Messiah. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will



baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unguenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

People come out of the woodwork at this time of year and appear in Church. What should be our stance to that? Of course there is a stance to those who come just at Christmas and there is a stance to those who question or comment in regards to aspects of faith. Where should we stand? Firstly, I can only say the situation is worth a comment as in the end I would still believe we wish the best for them. Let us go back a step and look at their complex situations. There is still a need to extend a credible witness or even invitation to the large numbers of the present generation who profess to be spiritual but not religious. In turning our attention to this group which draws great concern from Pope Francis and the bishops worldwide, some important questions come to mind. We can ask: What is actually happening here? Do we have people consciously rejecting what they perceive to be the negative trappings of the church? Or do we hear a cry of hunger to connect with a living presence of God which seems to be hidden or beyond the reach of their personal experience? In her book 'Forming Intentional Disciples', Sherry Weddell points out that these people indeed represent a growing category of the spiritually hungry and homeless. She suggests that because they may have a difficult time expressing their desire for a personal relationship with God and finding little or no satisfaction from the church, they just walk away. Can we dismiss their departures which is so painful - often within our own families - and simply allow these wanderers to remain disconnected, hungry, angry and kicking against what is nameless for them? I always live in hope that some will come back and find a parish that welcomes them at that right time for them. But lest we fall into the same trap might we consider the ways Jesus came and showed himself to the Apostles and somehow mysteriously has also entered our very lives. If we were to ask the question of the apostles Peter and his brother Andrew in a free and imaginary conversation, we might hear them say: "Well, he came to us on that bright blue cloudless day while we were casting our nets and seagulls silently soared on a gentle wind. He approached, introduced himself and simply said: 'Come follow me'''

For most of us, our personal encounter with the Lord did not have that kind of clarity as to date, time and place. However, it does make us ask how we have come to know the Lord's presence. Has it been an experience strong enough to convince us that he is indeed present, and furthermore, does it convince us that he will never abandon us? As we find ourselves in this Advent/ Christmas season we can ask the important question: "How has and will Christ come to us?" Of course the Saints would state over the years that he has come in history, mystery and grace. Maybe our answer is not as clear, but somehow I would hope that Christ is enabled to come to us because we have not only been open to his grace, but also taken that one step further of finding this openness to him has continued to let us experience his creative transformative presence or grace within our total lives as time has gone by. Nevertheless, next

to us at Christmas time will be people who are no doubt still grappling with this faith thing. Some of them will be our own family members. Yet for many of them their early memories and habits of faith will be enough to draw them to slip into a pew. Maybe they will stay longer than even Christmas! We hope so. Hopefully their early memories will lead them to a deeper threshold, the ultimate reason for the birth of Jesus. Yours 'In Christ'
