

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Luke's story-telling ability sparkles in the Pentecost story in the first reading, as the Acts of the Apostles is a continuation of his 'Gospel of Luke'. Luke portrays all of Jesus' disciples gathered when suddenly the sound of a wind fills the air and balls of fire like tongues hover over each one of them. They are all filled with the Holy Spirit who leads them to proclaim their message in languages they have never studied, but happened to be those the



pilgrims who heard them could understand. The two key elements of the story are the extraordinary influence of God's Spirit on the community and the breadth of the mission they were given the ability to accomplish. Accordingly, in our day it takes courage and generosity to pray our Responsorial Psalm of today: "Lord send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth".

Luke wants us to realise that the disciples were suddenly on fire with their message. When the Spirit exploded into their presence, they found themselves able, even impelled, to proclaim to others what it meant that Jesus was the good news. Not only were the disciples on fire with the message, but they were amazingly capable of sharing it with people with whom they had previously not been able to communicate. They found themselves united in a communion of hope and dreams, of faith and commitment, with people who literally did not speak their language. There is a rostered year 2 'Family Mass' on Sunday May 27th. As our present Principal, Jim Sheedy will have his last day here on Friday May 25th; there will be a 'thank you' emphasis for Mr Sheedy at our Sunday May 27th liturgy. Also, as we are expecting big numbers, there will be a marquee erected at the rear of the Parish Centre and light refreshments will be served at both the Parish Centre and in the marquee.

The Columban priests at North Essendon/Strathmore have been very generous to me and the parishes I have worked in over the years. For 26 years they have been coming to cover for me while I take my annual holidays in either October or November. Not once have they not turned up to celebrate the three Masses. Accordingly, as I have to celebrate First Communion Masses on Sunday June 24th, it would be great if some parishioners would take up the opportunity of the invite to the Columban Centenary Celebrations with a Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral at 11:00am and then refreshments at the Cardinal Knox Centre next door to the Cathedral from 12:00pm onwards.
