Did vou know?

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- Numbers are often significant in the Bible. The number forty denotes an extended period. Thus, in the story of Noah, rain falls for forty days; the Israelites wandered for forty years in the desert; and both Elijah and Moses fast for forty days before an encounter with God.
- ♦ Lent, a time of fasting, prayer and giving for all Christians, also runs for forty days and is a special time of final preparation for people who will be receiving the sacraments at Easter.
- This text comes immediately after the baptism of Jesus in Luke's Gospel. The baptism takes place in the lower reaches of the Jordan River, just north of the point where it enters the Dead Sea. This is a particularly desolate and barren region of dry river beds (wadis) and steep, rocky cliffs rising up from the Jordan Valley.
- The temple precinct in Jerusalem was built on a mountain. It comprised the temple itself and several courtyards surrounded by a very high wall. This is the parapet referred to in this text.

Making connections- Opportunities for personal prayer

- * What are the great temptations in your life?
- * In what ways have you been 'led by the Spirit through the wilderness'?
- * 'Man does not live on bread alone.' What nourishes your spiritual life?
- * Today's gospel presents Jesus' struggle to remain true to himself and his faith. Spend time reflecting on how you are feeling about the Rite of Election and the commitment you will make at Easter. Share your hopes and fears.
- * Spend time this week contemplating the difficult periods of your life and how they led you to new understandings of yourself, others and God. Reach out to someone who may be experiencing a difficult time in their lives.

Use the response to today's psalm as your prayer this week:

Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble.

Stewardship Corner

"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." (DEUTERONOMY 26:10)

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits" - the first and best that you have to offer, or do you give from what you have leftover? Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

Supporting the Parish

Through the Stewardship Program, parishioners are asked to pledge a weekly/monthly amount to the upkeep of the parish. This allows the parish to pay utility bills, insurance premiums, Archdiocese levies, purchase church supplies and pay staff wages. This amount is given as the "Thanksgiving Offering" and placed in the appropriate envelope or given as a direct debit.

The 'Presbytery Offering' along with any loose cash contributes to the support of the Parish Priest. A percentage of the Presbytery collection is also required to be sent quarterly to the Archdiocese.

Parish Safeguarding Committee.

The purpose of the Parish Safeguarding Committee is to assist the parish priest with the implementation of the parish safeguarding policy. This week the Committee held its regular monthly meeting and reviewed two of the ten child safety standards.

Standard 3: "Partnering with Families, Carers and Communities."

We assessed to what extent the parish of OLPH informs and involves families, carers and communities in promoting child safeguarding and what more we have to do as a parish to do this better.

Standard 7: "Ongoing Education and Training."

We assessed how well parish staff and volunteers are equipped with knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children safe through information, ongoing education and training. One result of the review is to put in place a module of induction training for new volunteers.
