Exploring the Word

Points of interest and Catholic lore

- The temple in Jerusalem was totally destroyed by the Romans in ad 70. Luke's Gospel was written after this event, so his readers would have known of its annihilation.
- Early Christian communities faced persecution both by the Jews, when
 they were expelled from the synagogues for their faith in Jesus as Messiah,
 and by the secular authorities for their refusal to worship the emperor as a
 god. Luke is clearly aware of the tribulations facing his community and
 seeks to allay their fears in this text.

Making connections - Opportunities for personal prayer

- Have you had to bear any ridicule or derision because of your decision to seek baptism?
- Describe a time of chaos or turmoil in your life. What sustained you or gave you strength through this difficult time?
- Have you had to face a great challenge that you feared you may not be able to endure?
- This week, accept those things that you cannot change and change for the better those things that you can.
- Use today's communion antiphon this week:

To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord.

Symbols and images

To describe the end of time, this gospel uses a kind of language commonly used in this period and known as 'apocalyptic' language. The language is symbolic and should not be read literally. Ultimately, this text is designed to give faith and hope to those who were suffering persecution. God will protect and sustain them.

Most people who live a grateful and generous lifestyle don't go around bragging about it. But through their words and actions, others do take notice. Supporting the Parish

Through the Stewardship Program, parishioners are asked to pledge a weekly/monthly amount to the upkeep of the parish. This allows the parish to pay utility bills, insurance premiums, Archdiocese levies, purchase church supplies and pay staff wages. This amount is given as the "Thanksgiving Offering" and placed in the appropriate envelope or given as a direct debit.

The 'Presbytery Offering' along with any loose cash contributes to the support of the Parish Priest. A percentage of the Presbytery collection is also required to be sent quarterly to the Archdiocese.
